The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that there is a critical housing shortage throughout Québec, including in the Gaspésie region;

THAT it acknowledge and endorse the requests for assistance that Gaspesian prefects and elected municipal officials have made to the Québec government;

THAT the National Assembly recognize that the new incentive zoning power will enable the municipalities to increase the number of housing units available in the territory;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Québec government to allow the MRCs to contribute more to housing development, in particular by granting them the power to offer financial incentives to developers.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Biron, Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie, together with Ms. Setlakwe (Mont-Royal—Outremont), Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), Ms. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly underline the career of Mr. Robert Dutrisac, President of the Press Gallery, parliamentary correspondent and editorial writer for *Le Devoir*'s Québec City office:

THAT it thank him for his contribution to parliamentary journalism and to the democratic life of Québec.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), together with Ms. Blanchette Vézina, Minister of Natural Resources and Forests, Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly take note that more than 160 forest fires are currently active in the territory of Québec;

THAT it express its solidarity with the thousands of affected and displaced Quebecers, in particular those from the Abitibi-Témiscamingue, Côte-Nord, Mauricie, Nord-du-Québec and Saguenay–Lac-Saint-Jean regions;

THAT it applaud the unrelenting work performed by hundreds of responders, in particular the SOPFEU personnel, firefighters, paramedics, police officers, civil protection, members of the military, municipal teams, volunteers and even many companies who are working hard to fight these fires and their impact on the population;

THAT it highlight with gratitude the involvement of international volunteer firefighters, in particular those from the United States and France, which serves as a powerful display of solidarity between nations;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly invite all Quebecers to comply with all safety instructions, in particular the prohibitions on accessing forests and on starting open fires in or near forests.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), together with Ms. Setlakwe (Mont-Royal-Outremont), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on obtaining an official Québec delegation to UNESCO; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Health and Social Services, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 15, An Act to make the health and social services system more effective;
- the Committee on Culture and Education, to continue its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 23, An Act to amend mainly the Education Act and to enact the Act respecting the Institut national d'excellence en education.

Mr. Lévesque, Second Vice-President, gave the following notice:

— the Committee on Labour and the Economy shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the possibility of carrying out an order of initiative on the emergence and development of GPT artificial intelligence technology and the upheaval that its arrival will bring to the Québec labour market.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 2 June 2023, on the motion moved by Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Government House Leader and Minister of Justice, for the passage of Bill 24, An Act to follow up on the recommendations of the report of the Comité consultatif indépendant sur la révision de l'indemnité annuelle des membres de l'Assemblée nationale.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Yeas: 68 Nays: 15 Abstentions: 0

Accordingly, Bill 24 was passed.

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Labour and the Economy on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 25, An Act to fight illegal tourist accommodation, together with the amendment transmitted by Mr. Grandmont (Taschereau).

The amendment was declared out of order because it introduces a new principle into the bill. The purpose of the bill is to establish a registration mechanism for tourist accommodation establishments and to create a public registry for those establishments. Meanwhile, the purpose of the amendment is to amend article 1959 of the *Civil Code of Québec*, which stipulates the conditions for which the lessor of a dwelling may evict a lessee. More specifically, the purpose of the amendment is to prevent lessors from evicting lessees in order to change the destination of the dwelling for use as tourist accommodation. Even though this amendment addresses the subject of tourist accommodation, it focuses on the distinct principle that is the limitation of the eviction powers conferred on lessors by the *Civil Code of Québec*.

The Chair also noted that even though the amendment was introduced in the parliamentary committee during the bill's clause-by-clause consideration without its receivability being raised, the Chair must nonetheless rule on its receivability, pursuant to Standing Order 252.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Transportation and the Environment on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 20, An Act to establish the Blue Fund and to amend other provisions.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

Passage

Ms. Bélanger, Minister Responsible for Seniors and Minister for Health, moved the passage of Bill 11, An Act to amend the Act respecting end-of-life care and other legislative provisions.

A debate arose thereon.

At 6:00 p.m., Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 7:30 p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 7:30 p.m.

The Assembly continued the debate on the motion moved by Ms. Bélanger, Minister Responsible for Seniors and Minister for Health, for the passage of Bill 11, An Act to amend the Act respecting end-of-life care and other legislative provisions.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.
