Deferred Divisions

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 84.3, Mr. Derraji, Official Opposition House Leader, together with Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on the "Report on the Implementation of the *Code of ethics and conduct of the Members of the National Assembly*" for the period from 1 January 2015 to 15 November 2019; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), together with Ms. Blanchette Vézina, Minister of Natural Resources and Forests, Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly applaud all the SOPFEU staff and frontline responders for their hard work to protect forests, communities and strategic infrastructure from the forest fires;

THAT it recall that climate change is increasing the risk of wildfire due to drier forest cover and longer heat waves;

THAT it note that there are currently 158 active forest fires;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government, as part of its efforts to adapt to climate change, to commit to increasing SOPFEU's response capacity.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), together with Mr. Cliche-Rivard (Saint-Henri– Sainte-Anne), moved a motion on temporary immigration; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), together with Mr. Fortin (Pontiac), Mr. Grandmont (Taschereau) and Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine), moved a motion on the parking plan for Hôpital Vaudreuil-Soulanges; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Dorismond (Marie-Victorin), together with Ms. Setlakwe (Mont-Royal–Outremont), Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 20-year career of singer-songwriter Corneille;

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Institutions on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 26, An Act to amend the Courts of Justice Act to, in particular, give effect to the agreement between the chief judge of the Court of Québec and the Minister of Justice, together with the amendments transmitted by Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister of Justice, and Mr. Morin (Acadie).

The amendments were declared in order, except the amendment transmitted by Mr. Morin (Acadie) as it introduces a new principle into the bill. The purpose of the bill is to increase the number of judges of the Court of Québec and make changes to the financing method of the Conseil de la magistrature. As for the amendment, its purpose is to create an advisory committee responsible for soliciting applications, conducting interviews and making recommendations to the Government in the context of the appointment process for certain judges' positions.

After debate thereon, the amendments were carried on division.

The amended report was concurred in on division.

Passage

Ms. Proulx, Minister of Tourism, moved the passage of Bill 25, An Act to fight illegal tourist accommodation.

A debate arose thereon.

At 12:59 p.m., Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3:00 p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3:00 p.m.

The Assembly continued the debate on the motion moved by Ms. Proulx, Minister of Tourism, for the passage of Bill 25, An Act to fight illegal tourist accommodation.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 25 was passed.
