

Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

At the request of the President, Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister of Justice, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

Motions Without Notice

Ms. Dufour (Mille-Îles), together with Mr. Bouazzi (Maurice-Richard), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on access to property; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Nadeau-Dubois, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, together with Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly deplore the rising food insecurity in Québec schools;

THAT it recall that access to healthy food for children is a determining factor in equal opportunity and educational success;

THAT it applaud the increasing mobilization of community organizations and civil society in favour of greater food security for children;

THAT it recognize the expertise of these organizations;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly ask the Government to aim to eliminate food insecurity in Québec schools.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), together with Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent), Mr. Bouazzi (Maurice-Richard) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly note the gas price disparity between Capitale-Nationale, Chaudière-Appalaches and other regions of Québec;

THAT it recognize that this disparity particularly affects citizens of the Capitale-Nationale region;

THAT it ask the Government to mandate the Office de la Protection du consommateur or any other competent organization to launch an inquiry into the lack of competition in the gas industry.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Lacombe, Minister of Culture and Communications, together with Ms. Setlakwe (Mont-Royal-Outremont), Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly pay tribute to Ms. Denise Bombardier, who passed away on 4 July 2023;

THAT it applaud her remarkable career as a journalist, essayist, author and media personality;

THAT it recognize her contribution to Québec's cultural life and, in particular, to the production of literary works in the French language;

THAT it offer its most sincere condolences to her family and loved ones;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly observe a minute of silence in her memory.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

- the Committee on Citizen Relations, to continue its public hearings within the framework of the general consultation on the consultation document entitled "Planning of Immigration to Québec for the 2024–2027 Period";
- the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to continue its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 29, An Act to protect consumers from planned obsolescence and to promote the durability, repairability and maintenance of goods.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 12 September 2023 on the motion moved by Mr. Drainville, Minister of Education, that Bill 23, An Act to amend mainly the Education Act and to enact the Act respecting the Institut national d'excellence en éducation, do now pass in principle.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried on division and Bill 23 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 23 be referred to the Committee on Culture and Education for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

At 11:56 a.m., at the request of Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, and by leave of the Assembly, Mr. Lévesque, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3:00 p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3:00 p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys) moved:

THAT the National Assembly declare that the CAQ government's lack of vision and lack of sufficient measures proposed with respect to housing, student financial assistance, support for SMEs, fighting the labour shortage and addressing the rising cost of living are detrimental to Québec's economy and the prosperity of Québec families.

Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; 54 minutes 15 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 29 minutes 34 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 18 minutes 41 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 6 minutes to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to the independent Member. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Member or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, the division on the motion moved by Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys) was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Thursday, 14 September 2023 at 9:40 a.m.

The motion was carried.

At 5:00 p.m., Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Thursday, 14 September 2023 at 9:40 a.m.
