

#### **Oral Questions and Answers**

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

#### **Deferred Divisions**

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred on 13 September 2023, on the motion moved by Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys) during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly declare that the CAQ government's lack of vision and lack of sufficient measures proposed with respect to housing, student financial assistance, support for SMEs, fighting the labour shortage and addressing the rising cost of living are detrimental to Québec's economy and the prosperity of Québec families.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

#### **Motions Without Notice**

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.3 and 185, Mr. Derraji, Official Opposition House Leader, together with Ms. Biron, Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie, Mr. Cliche-Rivard (Saint-Henri–Sainte-Anne), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly express its sincere condolences to the Moroccan people and to the members of Québec's Moroccan community, in particular the families affected by the massive earthquake of 8 September 2023, which claimed the lives of close to 2,946 people and injured more than 5,674 others;

THAT it stand in solidarity with the Moroccan people during these times of anguish, worry and pain brought forth by this natural disaster, and that it voice its grief over the lives lost, the many wounded and those affected by the disaster;

THAT it highlight the courage and resilience of the Moroccan people and the large Moroccan community in Québec in response to this ordeal, that it reiterate its unwavering solidarity and that it express its willingness to provide assistance at this critical time:

THAT, lastly, it observe a minute of silence in memory of the victims of this tragedy.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the request of the President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), together with Ms. Cadet (Bourassa-Sauvé), Mr. Leduc, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on the remuneration of student interns in the public service; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Blanchette Vézina, Minister of Natural Resources and Forests, together with Mr. Fortin (Pontiac), Ms. Zaga Mendez (Verdun), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly thank all the SOPFEU staff for their hard work to protect Québec's forests, communities and infrastructure from the forest fires:

THAT it applaud the partners and the international assistance received in the context of this unprecedent forest fire episode;

THAT it take note of the area affected by forest fires in 2023, which is nearly 100 times larger than the average area affected over the last 10 years;

THAT, lastly, it reiterate the importance of the forest, its environmental, economic and intergenerational contribution as well as the need for action to increase its resilience in the face of climate change.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Grandmont (Taschereau), together with Ms. Prass (D'Arcy-McGee), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly take note of the most recent report that counted 10,000 people experiencing homelessness, which is an increase of 44 % since the previous report from 2018;

THAT it recognize that there is currently a homelessness crisis in Québec.

The question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.
