

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 20 September 2023, on the motion moved by Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister of Justice, that Bill 29, An Act to protect consumers from planned obsolescence and to promote the durability, repairability and maintenance of goods, do now pass in principle.

Mr. Caire, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 29 be referred to the Committee on Labour and the Economy for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

The Assembly took the divisions, which had been deferred at the sitting of 20 September 2023, on the motion moved by Mr. Grandmont (Taschereau) and on the amendment motion moved by Ms. Guilbault, Minister of Transport and Sustainable Mobility, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

The question was first put on the amendment motion moved by Ms. Guilbault, Minister of Transport and Sustainable Mobility.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for Taschereau be amended as follows:

- 1. By replacing the words "that municipalities are autonomous" in the first paragraph by the words "the importance of the partnership between the Québec government and the municipalities";
- 2. By replacing the words "to commit to supporting this project, without interference, and to continue investing the sums necessary to carry it out" in the last paragraph by the words "to continue its collaboration with the Ville in carrying out the project".

The motion was carried on the following vote:

The question was then put on the motion moved by Mr. Grandmont (Taschereau), as amended.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recall the importance of the partnership between the Québec government and the municipalities with regard to the planning and implementation of public transit projects;

THAT it reiterate its support for Ville de Québec's current tramway and structuring network project;

THAT it ask the Government to continue its collaboration with the Ville in carrying out the project.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Fortin (Pontiac), together with Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on the modernization of Hôpital Maisonneuve-Rosemont; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), together with Ms. Biron, Minister Responsible for the Status of Women, Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly condemn the hateful and discriminatory comments made towards members of the LGBTQI2S+ community in the public sphere, in particular during recent protests;

THAT, in this context, it reiterate its adherence to the motion unanimously carried on 4 April 2023 stating that "exposing children to differences helps make Québec a model of equality and equity for gender plural communities all over the world";

THAT it ask all the political parties represented in this House to contribute, through their words and deeds, to making Québec a place of equality, dignity and security for all Quebecers, regardless of their sexual orientation or gender identity;

THAT, lastly the National Assembly express its solidarity with transgender and non-binary people and all members of the LGBTQI2S+ community, whose fundamental rights must be guaranteed and protected.

The question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) moved:
