

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), together with Mr. Bouazzi (Maurice-Richard), Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge that according to Association Restauration Québec, 80% of Québec restaurant owners received a loan from the federal government during the COVID-19 pandemic;

THAT it recall that part of this loan constitutes a subsidy if it is repaid by the given deadline;

THAT it underline that a considerable number of small and medium-sized restaurant businesses have yet to begin repaying their loans, in particular due to the current economic context marked by a major rise in inflation and the labour shortage;
