

Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

At the request of the President, Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve) withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred on 27 September 2023, on the motion moved by Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent) during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly deplore the fact that Quebecers are paying the price for the CAQ government's improvisation and inability to carry out large-scale infrastructure projects in a timely manner, in particular in the health, childcare and transport sectors;

THAT, lastly, it urge the CAQ government to exercise greater rigour in the planning of infrastructure projects to deliver them with the utmost speed, in keeping with Quebecers' ability to pay.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Biron, Minister Responsible for the Status of Women, together with Ms. Garceau (Robert-Baldwin), Ms. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the passing of Ms. Gaëlle Fedida, former political affairs coordinator for the Alliance des maisons d'hébergement de deuxième étape pour femmes et enfants victimes de violence conjugale;

THAT it remember this determined feminist activist who advanced the cause of women victims of domestic violence and their children;

THAT the National Assembly reiterate the importance of combating domestic violence and supporting its victims;

THAT, lastly, it observe a minute of silence in her memory.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the request of Mr. Lévesque, Second Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Mr. Derraji, Official Opposition House Leader, together with Mr. Cliche-Rivard (Saint-Henri–Sainte-Anne) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on delays in the processing of family class cases; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), together with Mr. Lafrenière, Minister Responsible for Relations with the First Nations and the Inuit, Mr. Morin (Acadie), Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recall the death of Joyce Echaquan, which occurred under tragic circumstances on 28 September 2020 at the Joliette hospital;

THAT it reiterate its condolences to her spouse, her children and the Atikamekw community of Manawan;

THAT it recognize that members of the First Nations and the Inuit have the right to fair access, without discrimination, to all health and social services and that they may achieve the best possible physical, mental, emotional and spiritual health;

THAT it underline the importance of recognizing and respecting traditional and living Indigenous wisdom and knowledge in the field of health;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly observe a minute of silence in memory of Joyce Echaquan.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the request of Mr. Lévesque, Second Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) moved a motion on temporary immigration and Québec's reception capacity; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Caire, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

 the Committee on Culture and Education, to undertake clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 23, An Act to amend mainly the Education Act and to enact the Act respecting the Institut national d'excellence en éducation;

- the Committee on Health and Social Services, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 15, An Act to make the health and social services system more effective;
- the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to undertake clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 17, An Act to amend various provisions for the main purpose of reducing regulatory and administrative burden;
- the Committee on Citizen Relations, to continue its public hearings within the framework of the general consultation on the consultation document entitled "Planning of Immigration to Québec for the 2024–2027 Period";
- the Committee on Institutions, to undertake public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 34, An Act to modernize the notarial profession and to promote access to justice.

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Labour and the Economy on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 29, An Act to protect consumers from planned obsolescence and to promote the durability, repairability and maintenance of goods.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Institutions on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 14, An Act to amend various provisions relating to public security and to enact the Act to assist in locating missing persons, together with the amendments transmitted by Mr. Bonnardel, Minister of Public Security, Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis) and Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion).

The amendments were declared in order.

After debate thereon, the question was put on the amendment proposed by Mr. Bonnardel, Minister of Public Security.

The amendment was carried.

By leave of the Assembly, Mr. Lévesque, Second Vice-President, put the question individually on the amendments proposed by Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis) and Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion) and on the reading thereof.

The amendments were negatived.

The amended report was concurred in on division.

Debates upon Adjournment

At 1:01 p.m., the Assembly held three debates upon adjournment:

- the first, on a question from Mr. Morin (Acadie) to Ms. Guilbault, Minister of Transport and Sustainable Mobility, about the CAQ government's inability to deliver large-scale infrastructure projects;
- the second, on a question from Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage) to Mr. Charette Minister of the Environment, the Fight Against Climate Change, Wildlife and Parks, about nickel levels in the air. Mr. Caire, Minister of Cybersecurity and Digital Technology, replaced the Minister for this debate;

 the third, on a question from Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis) to
Ms. Roy, Minister of Families, about the CAQ government's inability to
deliver the required spaces in CPEs.

Mr. Caire, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Tuesday, 3 October 2023 at 10:00 a.m.

The motion was carried.
