Motions Without Notice

Mr. Grandmont (Taschereau), together with Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine), moved a motion on transportation in the Québec City area; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine), together with Mr. Fortin (Pontiac), Mr. Marissal (Rosemont) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on hospital needs in Drummondville; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Ms. Fréchette, Minister of Immigration, Francization and Integration, moved a motion on the management of immigration to Québec; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Ms. Cadet (Bourassa-Sauvé), together with Mr. Bouazzi (Maurice-Richard), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on the labour market issues of the Northvolt project and the battery industry; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage

Ms. LeBel, Minister Responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, moved the passage of Bill 33, An Act respecting the collective agreements of the special constables and the bodyguards of the Gouvernement du Québec.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 33 was passed.

At 11:13 a.m., at the request of Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3:00 p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Ms. Maccarone (Westmount-Saint-Louis) moved:

THAT the National Assembly recall that on 24 May, following the death of Sergeant Maureen Breau, the Member for Maskinongé tabled a petition with 24,000 signatures asking the Québec government for better support for police interventions with potentially violent individuals in a perturbed mental state;

THAT it recall that on 13 September, the CAQ Members refused to examine this petition in parliamentary committee;

THAT it note that over the last five years, the number of police interventions with a person in a perturbed mental state has increased dramatically;

THAT it recall that on 2 April, the Official Opposition tabled an order of initiative to study this issue which affects the safety of police officers and the public;

THAT, lastly, it ask the CAQ government to hold, without delay, a public debate in parliamentary committee on the issue of perturbed mental states and police interventions.

Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for her reply; 54 minutes 15 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 29 minutes 24 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 18 minutes 41 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 6 minutes to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to the independent Member. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Member or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, the division on the motion moved by Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis) was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Thursday, 5 October 2023 at 9:40 a.m.

The motion was carried.
