By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, together with Mr. Lacombe, Minister of Culture and Communications, Mr. Tanguay, Leader of the Official Opposition, Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil) and Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), moved:

THAT the National Assembly pay tribute to Mr. Karl Tremblay, who passed away on 15 November 2023;

THAT it recall that Karl Tremblay was the singer, a songwriter and a founding member of the band Les Cowboys Fringants since 1995, a band which won the Félix Award for Group of the Year in 2003, 2004, 2011, 2020, 2021 and 2023;

THAT it also recall that Karl Tremblay and Les Cowboys Fringants received the Medal of Honour of the National Assembly in 2023:

THAT it recognize Karl Tremblay's exceptional contribution to Québec song and to its recognition abroad, in particular in Europe, where his voice helped make Les Cowboys Fringants a symbol of Québec culture;

THAT it underline the deep affection of Quebecers of all generations for the musical work of Karl Tremblay and Les Cowboys Fringants and its unique place in our culture;

THAT it also highlight his commitment to the causes of ecology, social justice and the freedom of Quebecers;

THAT it recognize his courage and generosity while battling prostate cancer;

THAT it extend its most sincere condolences to his family and loved ones;

THAT, lastly, it observe a minute of silence in his memory.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), together with Ms. Biron, Minister Responsible for the Status of Women, Ms. Garceau (Robert-Baldwin), Mr. Saint-Pierre-Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil) and Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), moved:

THAT the National Assembly highlight the importance of the investigative work of journalist Léa Carrier on the matter of masculinity influencers;

THAT it condemn the hate campaign against her since the publication of her article.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.
