THAT it declare that the achievements of this pioneer laid the foundations for the emergence of a French-speaking business community proud of its roots;

THAT it recall his profoundly human leadership style, mentioned by all who knew him;

THAT it recall that Bernard Lemaire was awarded multiples distinctions during his lifetime, including Officer of the Order of Canada in 1988 and Knight of the Order of the Legion of Honour in 2002;

THAT it extend its most sincere condolences to his family and loved ones, and to the entire Cascades and Boralex family;

THAT, lastly, it observe a minute of silence in his memory.

Report Stage
