THAT it underline that more than \$4.6 million was distributed in 2022 to support food aid organizations;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly ask all Quebecers to show generosity and solidarity toward one another during this holiday season, in a context that is difficult for many of our fellow citizens.

THAT it reiterate that under-represented groups' access to the industry and skills development are factors that will help attract an additional pool of workers;

THAT, consequently, the National Assembly recognize that a modernization of the construction industry is necessary, in collaboration with the workers and partners in the construction sector.
