Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 31 January 2024, on the motion moved by Ms. McGraw (Notre-Dame-de-Grâce) for the passage of Bill 595, An Act to proclaim Québec Perinatal Bereavement Awareness Day.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Accordingly, Bill 595 was passed.

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 31 January 2024, on the motion moved by Mr. Kelley (Jacques-Cartier) during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge that the CAQ government's inadequate planning regarding energy needs is hindering the development of Québec's small and medium-sized businesses;

THAT, given the scope of the issues Québec is facing, it once again ask the CAQ government to hold a real province-wide consultation on energy so that Quebecers can voice their opinions on possible solutions.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Paradis (Jean-Talon), together with Mr. Kelley (Jacques-Cartier), Mr. Bouazzi (Maurice-Richard) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on maintaining Hydro-Québec's monopoly on electricity distribution and sale to third parties; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Fitzgibbon, Minister of Economy, Innovation and Energy, together with Mr. Kelley (Jacques-Cartier), Mr. Bouazzi (Maurice-Richard) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly affirm that it is not desirable to imitate or draw inspiration from a foreign model, such as Sweden, where power generation is deregulated to the benefit of the private sector;

THAT the National Assembly recall that Hydro-Québec has a monopoly on distribution and the electrical transmission system in Québec and that it is important that this remains intact.

The question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Ms. Garceau (Robert-Baldwin), together with Mr. Cliche-Rivard (Saint-Henri-Sainte-Anne), Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on cases of mothers who are victims of domestic violence and who lose custody of their children; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

1 February 2024

Mr. Cliche-Rivard (Saint-Henri–Sainte-Anne), moved:

THAT the National Assembly reiterate that Québec and all other jurisdictions in Canada have international and humanitarian obligations towards asylum seekers;

THAT it recall that Québec has long been, and must continue to be, a haven for men and women fleeing war, persecution and humanitarian crises;

THAT it underline that Québec has been receiving more than its fair share of asylum requests compared to other Canadian provinces in recent years;

THAT it demand that the federal government fulfil its humanitarian obligations and collaborate with Québec and the Canadian provinces to welcome asylum seekers in a concerted and caring manner, while taking into account their vulnerability and the capacities of each jurisdiction;

THAT the National Assembly underline the insufficient nature of the recent announcement to refund \$100 million to Québec for its reception and support of asylum seekers;

THAT, therefore, it ask the Canadian government to grant the \$470 million requested by the Québec government.
