

Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Québec government to take all necessary measures to obtain full access, without redaction and with respect for legally recognized privileges, to Chapter 3 of Volume 2 of the final report of the Commission of Inquiry on the Awarding and Management of Public Contracts in the Construction Industry, regarding the contract awarding schemes of Mayor Vaillancourt's administration in Laval.

The motion was carried.

Mr. Roberge, Minister of the French Language, together with Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), moved a motion on affirming that the Québec nation's strength lies in the

defence and promotion of the French language; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Ms. McGraw (Notre-Dame-de-Grâce), together with Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke), Mr. Paradis (Jean-Talon) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on funding for food banks; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke) moved:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge the mobilization of citizens with regard to the impacts of the increasing use of rail transportation;

THAT it recognize that the noise caused by rail transportation, specifically by whistles at grade crossings, has an impact on the health of those who live near the railways;

THAT the National Assembly ask the federal government to review regulations on the use of whistles at grade crossings to improve citizens' quality of life, in particular at night.

The question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

 the Committee on Transportation and the Environment, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 41, An Act to enact the Act respecting the environmental performance of buildings and to amend various provisions regarding energy transition;

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 the Committee on Citizen Relations, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 46, An Act to improve the protection of children receiving educational childcare services.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 143, Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, gave the following notice:

 the Committee on the National Assembly shall hold a public meeting to continue its examination of the preliminary report of the Commission de la représentation électorale.

He then gave the following notice:

— the Committee on Transportation and the Environment shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the possibility of examining a petition on creating a permanent youth climate advisory committee at the National Assembly, and to discuss the possibility of examining a petition on carrying out a BAPE inquiry prior to the establishment of the Northvolt battery factory.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Carmant, Minister Responsible for Social Services, moved that Bill 37, An Act respecting the Commissioner for Children's Well-Being and Rights, do now pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

At 1:00 p.m., Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3:00 p.m.

Accordingly, pursuant to Standing Order 97, the debate on the motion moved by Mr. Carmant, Minister Responsible for Social Services, was adjourned in the name of Mr. Cliche-Rivard (Saint-Henri–Sainte-Anne).

The proceedings resumed at 3:00 p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Derraji, Official Opposition House Leader, moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask the CAQ government to promote road safety in Québec by implementing administrative sanctions once a blood alcohol concentration level of 0.05% is reached.

Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; 54 minutes 15 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 29 minutes 27 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 18 minutes 36 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 6 minutes 12 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to the independent Member. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Member or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, the division on the motion moved by Mr. Derraji, Official Opposition House Leader, was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned earlier in the sitting, on the motion moved by Mr. Carmant, Minister Responsible for Social Services, that Bill 37, An Act respecting the Commissioner for Children's Well-Being and Rights, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried, and Bill 37 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 37 be referred to the Committee on Health and Social Services for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

Ms. Guilbault, Minister of Transport and Sustainable Mobility, moved that Bill 48, An Act to amend mainly the Highway Safety Code to introduce provisions relating to detection systems and other highway safety-related provisions, do now pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate was adjourned in the name of Mr. Derraji, Official Opposition House Leader.

At 6:30 p.m., Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Thursday, 15 February 2024 at 9:40 a.m.
