

#### **Introduction of Bills**

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

At the request of the President, Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon (Camille-Laurin) withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

#### **Deferred Divisions**

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred on 14 February 2024, on the motion moved by Mr. Derraji, Official Opposition House Leader, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly ask the CAQ government to promote road safety in Québec by implementing administrative sanctions once a blood alcohol concentration level of 0.05% is reached.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

#### **Motions Without Notice**

Ms. Blanchette Vézina, Minister of Natural Resources and Forests, moved:

THAT the National Assembly highlight the significant efforts made by the Québec government to ensure rapid harvesting of burnt wood and completion of silvicultural work following the forest fires of summer 2023;

THAT it recognize that major reforestation actions will be needed across hundreds of thousands of hectares to bring burned stands back into production, in order to ensure the socio-economic vitality of the affected forest communities;

THAT it underline that silvicultural work is important in the fight against climate change, in particular because of the trees' process to capture carbon;

THAT it recall the need to co-operate with the First Nations in forestry matters;

THAT it reaffirm to the Government of Canada that natural resources are under Québec's jurisdiction and that Québec is responsible for determining its reforestation priorities;

THAT, accordingly, it add its voice to that of hundreds of Québec forestry sector stakeholders in calling on the Government of Canada to relax the conditions for using its 2 Billion Trees program, in order to meet the socio-economic and environmental challenges of our regions.

The	motion	MAC	carried.

Ms. Garceau (Robert-Baldwin), together with Mr. Cliche-Rivard (Saint-Henri–Sainte-Anne) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on amending Bill 37 to respect the requests of Indigenous organizations; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), together with Mr. Lamontagne, Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, Mr. Fortin (Pontiac), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge the recommendations of researchers at Fisheries and Oceans Canada since 2016 in regard to the redfish file;

THAT it express its concern regarding the current redfish quota allocation, which is not adapted to industry demands;

THAT it reiterate that Québec's requests have always been for historical shares to be respected and for active fishers and those who are struggling to be prioritized in the allocation of quotas; THAT it express its concern and support for the shrimp fleet, which is severely affected by the drop in quotas, as are the groundfish fishers, who have seen a drastic decrease in groundfish biomass;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly demand that the federal government increase Québec's redfish fishery quota while promoting smaller boats that ensure the sustainability of Quebec's coastal communities.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), together with Mr. Derraji, Official Opposition House Leader, Mr. Bouazzi (Maurice-Richard) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on the appointment of a Parliamentary Budget Officer; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

#### **Notices of Proceedings in Committees**

Mr. Caire, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Transportation and the Environment, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 41, An Act to enact the Act respecting the environmental performance of buildings and to amend various provisions regarding energy transition;
- the Committee on Citizen Relations, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 46, An Act to improve the protection of children receiving educational childcare services;
- the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 42, An Act to prevent and fight psychological harassment and sexual violence in the workplace;

 the Committee on Health and Social Services, to undertake clause-byclause consideration of Bill 37, An Act respecting the Commissioner for Children's Well-Being and Rights.

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By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 143, Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, gave the following notice:

 the Committee on the National Assembly shall hold a public meeting to continue its examination of the preliminary report of the Commission de la représentation électorale.

#### **Government Bills**

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 14 February 2024, on the motion moved by Ms. Guilbault, Minister of Transport and Sustainable Mobility, that Bill 48, An Act to amend mainly the Highway Safety Code to introduce provisions relating to detection systems and other highway safety-related provisions, do now pass in principle.

- the second, on a question from Ms. Setlakwe (Mont-Royal-Outremont) to Mr. Caire, Minister of Cybersecurity and Digital Technology, about the data leak affecting Laval citizens.

At 1:26 p.m., Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 2:30 p.m.

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The proceedings resumed at 2:30 p.m.

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#### **Government Bills**

Passage in Principle

The Assembly continued the debate on the motion moved by Ms. Guilbault, Minister of Transport and Sustainable Mobility, that Bill 48, An Act to amend mainly the Highway Safety Code to introduce provisions relating to detection systems and other highway safety-related provisions, do now pass in principle.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Caire, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Passage

Ms. Duranceau, Minister Responsible for Housing, moved the passage of Bill 31, An Act to amend various legislative provisions with respect to housing.

The debate was adjourned in the name of Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion).
