

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 15 February 2024, on the motion moved by Ms. Duranceau, Minister Responsible for Housing, for the passage of Bill 31, An Act to amend various legislative provisions with respect to housing.

At 11:59 a.m., Mr. Lévesque, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 1:40 p.m.

Accordingly, pursuant to Standing Order 52, the debate on the motion moved by Ms. Duranceau, Minister Responsible for Housing, was adjourned.

The proceedings resumed at 1:40 p.m.

Introduction of Bills

Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister of Justice, moved that leave be granted to introduce the following bill:

54 An Act to follow up on the Table Justice-Québec with a view to reducing processing times in criminal and penal matters and to make the administration of justice more efficient

The motion was carried.

Accordingly, Bill 54 was introduced in the Assembly.

Mr. Bouazzi (Maurice-Richard) moved that leave be granted to introduce the following bill:

599 An Act to amend mainly the Act respecting the Québec Pension Plan to abolish the reduction of the retirement pension of a person who receives a disability pension between 60 and 65 years of age

Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Government House Leader, raised a point of privilege. He alleged that the Second Opposition Group acted in contempt of Parliament by implying that Bill 599, An Act to amend mainly the Act respecting the Québec Pension Plan to abolish the reduction of the retirement pension of a person who receives a disability pension between 60 and 65 years of age had already been introduced, by presuming the Assembly's decision to consider the bill and by disclosing certain elements before its introduction.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 53, Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Government House Leader, tabled the following:

At the request of the President, Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 53 and 59, Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil) tabled the following:

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 15 February 2024, on the motion moved by Ms. Guilbault, Minister of Transport and Sustainable Mobility, that Bill 48, An Act to amend mainly the Highway Safety Code to introduce provisions relating to detection systems and other highway safety-related provisions, do now pass in principle.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Yeas: 116 Nays: 0 Abstentions: 0

Accordingly, Bill 48 was passed in principle.

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 48 be referred to the Committee on Transportation and the Environment for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

Motions Without Notice

Ms. Rotiroti (Jeanne-Mance–Viger), together with Mr. Grandmont (Taschereau), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on the forecast of economic benefits related to the replacement of the Olympic Stadium roof; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent. Mr. Grandmont (Taschereau), together with Mr. Derraji, Official Opposition House Leader, Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on investment in public transportation in the regions; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, together with Mr. Roberge, Minister Responsible for Canadian Relations and the Canadian Francophonie, moved a motion on the repatriation of all immigration powers from the Government of Canada; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Ms. Déry, Minister of Higher Education, moved a motion on the presence of a Québec Government office abroad; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Transportation and the Environment, to undertake clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 48, An Act to amend mainly the Highway Safety Code to introduce provisions relating to detection systems and other highway safety-related provisions;
- the Committee on Citizen Relations, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 46, An Act to improve the protection of children receiving educational childcare services;

- the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 42, An Act to prevent and fight psychological harassment and sexual violence in the workplace;
- the Committee on Health and Social Services, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 37, An Act respecting the Commissioner for Children's Well-Being and Rights.

Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, gave the following notice:

— the Committee on Public Administration shall hold a deliberative meeting to follow up on Recommendation 1.3 of the Committee's 2021 spring report, "THAT the Committee on Public Administration initiate reflection on the opportunity to examine the Government's consolidated financial statements in parliamentary committee".

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 21 February 2024, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Bouazzi (Maurice-Richard).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recall that the recent tax cut for taxpayers earning more than \$100,000 a year deprives the Québec State of more than \$400 million per year;

THAT the National Assembly recognize that this Government decision contributes to the deficit and undermines the funding of public services.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned earlier in today's sitting, on the motion moved by Ms. Duranceau, Minister Responsible for Housing, for the passage of Bill 31, An Act to amend various legislative provisions with respect to housing.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Passage in Principle

Mr. Fitzgibbon, Minister of Economy, Innovation and Energy, moved that Bill 44, An Act to amend mainly the Act respecting the Ministère de l'Économie et de l'Innovation with respect to research, do now pass in principle.

Mr. Skeete, Minister for the Economy, informed the Assembly that the Honourable Manon Jeannotte, Lieutenant-Governor of Québec, recommended Bill 44 for its consideration.

A debate arose thereon.

At 4:56 p.m., Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for a few minutes.

The proceedings resumed at 5:04 p.m.

After debate, thereon, the motion was carried on division and, accordingly, Bill 44 was passed in principle.

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 44 be referred to the Committee on Labour and the Economy for clause-by-clause consideration and that the Minister for the Economy be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

The motion was carried.

Passage in Principle

Mr. Roberge, Minister Responsible for Laicity, moved that Bill 52, An Act to enable the Parliament of Québec to preserve the principle of parliamentary sovereignty with respect to the Act respecting the laicity of the State, do now pass in principle.

After debate, thereon, the motion was carried on division and, accordingly, Bill 52 was passed in principle.

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 52 be referred to the Committee on Citizen Relations for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

Passage in Principle

Mr. Girard, Minister of Finance, moved that Bill 49, An Act to give effect to fiscal measures announced in the Budget Speech delivered on 21 March 2023 and to certain other measures, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried on division and, accordingly, Bill 49 was passed in principle.

Ms. Proulx, Minister of Tourism, informed the Assembly that the Honourable Manon Jeannotte, Lieutenant-Governor of Québec, recommended Bill 49 for its consideration.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried on division and, accordingly, Bill 49 was passed in principle.

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 49 be referred to the Committee on Public Finance for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

Debates upon Adjournment

At 6:30 p.m., the Assembly held a debate upon adjournment on a question from Ms. Rotiroti (Jeanne-Mance–Viger) to Ms. Proulx, Minister of Tourism, about the CAQ government's investment in the Olympic Stadium.

At 6:43 p.m., Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Wednesday, 21 February 2024 at 9:40 a.m.
