

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Ms. Charest, Minister Responsible for Sports, Recreation and the Outdoors, moved that Bill 45, An Act to amend the Act respecting safety in sports mainly to better protect the integrity of persons in recreation and sports, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried, and Bill 45 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 45 be referred to the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 28 March 2024, on the motion moved by Mr. Drainville, Minister of Education, for the passage of Bill 47, An Act to reinforce the protection of students, including with regard to acts of sexual violence (*modified title*).

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Accordingly, Bill 47 was passed.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Derraji, Official Opposition House Leader, together with Ms. Zaga Mendez (Verdun), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on the battery industry; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Grandmont (Taschereau) moved a motion on funding for the operations and maintenance of the Société de transport de Montréal; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Paradis (Jean-Talon), together with Mr. Fortin (Pontiac), Mr. Grandmont (Taschereau) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on funding for the Coopérative de solidarité SABSA; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Poulin (Beauce-Sud), together with Mr. Morin (Acadie), Mr. Cliche-Rivard (Saint-Henri–Sainte-Anne), Mr. Paradis (Jean-Talon) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly honour the memory of Quebecer and Beauceron Jacob Flickinger, 33, who passed away on 1 April 2024, in Gaza, while working for the NGO World Central Kitchen;

THAT it recall that this soldier and veteran of the Canadian Armed Forces, who was both a son and a father, was doing humanitarian work to bring food aid to the Palestinian people;

THAT it deplore the fact that, like too many civilians and innocents in this war, he tragically lost his life;

THAT it honour his devotion, bravery and heroism, for which he must never be forgotten;

THAT the National Assembly extend its sincere condolences to his parents, his spouse and his young child;

THAT the National Assembly observe a minute of silence in memory of Jacob Flickinger.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

At the request of Mr. Lévesque, Second Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Citizen Relations, to continue its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 52, An Act to enable the Parliament of Québec to preserve the principle of parliamentary sovereignty with respect to the Act respecting the laicity of the State;
- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to continue its clauseby-clause consideration of Bill 50, An Act to enact the Act respecting civil protection to promote disaster resilience and to amend various provisions relating in particular to emergency communication centres and to forest fire protection;
- the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 44, An Act to amend mainly the Act respecting the Ministère de l'Économie et de l'Innovation with respect to research.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mr. Lévesque, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 10 April 2024 during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Ms. Cadet (Bourassa-Sauvé).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly take note of the demands of Québec college and university students who are denouncing unpaid internships in the public sector; THAT it underline that the majority of the jobs affected by unpaid internships are female-dominated;

THAT it recall that the Minister of Higher Education stated during an 11 April 2023 interview that interns deserve to be paid;

THAT it recall the motion carried unanimously on 25 October 2023 asking to "implement remuneration for internships in the public sector as soon as possible";

THAT, lastly, it ask the CAQ government to put its words into action and present a timeline for implementing remuneration for internships in the public sector and to do so by the end of this parliamentary session.

At 3:10 p.m., at the request of Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, Mr. Lévesque, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until the expiry of the time limit for receiving notices for debates upon adjournment.

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Wednesday, 10 April 2024.
