

Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 10 April 2024, on the motion moved by Ms. Cadet (Bourassa-Sauvé) during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly take note of the demands of Québec college and university students who are denouncing unpaid internships in the public sector;

THAT it underline that the majority of the jobs affected by unpaid internships are female-dominated;

THAT it recall that the Minister of Higher Education stated during an 11 April 2023 interview that interns deserve to be paid;

THAT it recall the motion carried unanimously on 25 October 2023 asking to "implement remuneration for internships in the public sector as soon as possible";

THAT, lastly, it ask the CAQ government to put its words into action and present a timeline for implementing remuneration for internships in the public sector and to do so by the end of this parliamentary session.
