

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 129 and 134, Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, moved:

THAT the changes in the membership of the standing committees as provided for in the report from the steering committee of the Committee on the National Assembly be adopted.

Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), together with Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister of Justice, moved a motion on the *Act respecting the laicity of the State*; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Skeete, Minister Responsible for the Fight Against Racism, together with Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), moved:

THAT the National Assembly denounce the federal government's intention to broaden access to halal mortgages;

THAT it affirm that treating people differently according to their religious beliefs is discriminatory and contradicts the notion of laicity of the State.

The question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), together with Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask the CAQ government to honour its commitment to not increase the tax burden on middle class Quebecers.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Grandmont (Taschereau), together with Ms. Guilbault, Minister of Transport and Sustainable Mobility, Mr. Derraji, Official Opposition House Leader, Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recall that, according to a 2020 study on the state of cycling in Québec, there are over 4.5 million utility, recreational and athletic cyclists in Québec;

THAT it underline the considerable contribution of cycling to Québec's economy, whether for recreation, tourism, territorial development or transportation, and its importance in greenhouse gas reduction and health prevention in Québec;

THAT it recall that according to a study on the economic benefits of bicycle tourism and the bicycle market in Québec, cycling contributes \$1.2 billion to tourism and retail spending every year and, according to the state of cycling in Québec, it represents \$2 billion in savings for our health systems through the adoption of a healthy, active lifestyle;

THAT it recognize that cycling is a vehicle for inclusivity, equity, and emancipation, and is one of the most straightforward and efficient means to meet our sustainable mobility objectives;

THAT it underline that May is the month when many municipalities and civil society organizations organize activities to promote cycling, and when most Quebecers resume cycling;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly ask the Québec government to mark May as Québec Cycling Month.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.
