The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

24 April 2024

At the request of the President, Mr. Dubé, Minister of Health, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Boulet, Minister of Labour, together with Ms. Cadet (Bourassa-Sauvé), Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), Mr. Paradis (Jean-Talon), Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil) and Mr. Lefebvre (Arthabaska), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark Memorial Day for Persons Killed or Injured on the Job, held each year on 28 April;

THAT it underline that last year, the number of employment injuries, excluding those associated with COVID-19, decreased by 11% compared to pre-pandemic numbers;

THAT despite these encouraging statistics, the National Assembly use this day to reiterate that workers' health and safety is, and will remain, a priority in Québec;

THAT it recall that each work-related accident or illness involves loved ones, family members, friends and colleagues who are directly affected, left behind and deeply impacted;

THAT the National Assembly observe a minute of silence to honour the memory of those who died or were injured on the job.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

At the request of Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

24 April 2024

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Lakhoyan Olivier (Chomedey), together with Ms. Haytayan (Laval-des-Rapides), Mr. Cliche-Rivard (Saint-Henri-Sainte-Anne), Mr. Paradis (Jean-Talon), Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil) and Mr. Lefebvre (Arthabaska), moved:

THAT the National Assembly do its duty to remember and commemorate the Armenian genocide, one of the worst tragedies to mark the early 20th century;

THAT it pay tribute to the 1.5-million victims who perished 109 years ago during the sombre events that began in April 1915 and that it express its solidarity with the Armenian people and diaspora;

THAT it recall that, in recent years, the Armenian people have once again been the victims of a bloody conflict in the Nagorno-Karabakh region;

THAT it call wholeheartedly for a more just, peaceful and egalitarian world and that it reiterate its firm commitment to fighting all forms of racial, ethnic and religious hatred and discrimination;

THAT, lastly, the Members of this Assembly observe a minute of silence in memory of the victims.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the request of Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Mr. Grandmont (Taschereau), together with Mr. Derraji, Official Opposition House Leader, Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on public transit services; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

24 April 2024

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), together with Ms. Blanchette Vézina, Minister Responsible for the Bas-Saint-Laurent Region and the Gaspésie–Îles-de-la-Madeleine Region, moved:

THAT the National Assembly affirm that the project to extend Autoroute 20 between Notre-Dame-des-Neiges and Rimouski is essential to ensure road safety for the residents of eastern Québec as well as for the region's economic development;

THAT it affirm the need to complete this project, currently under study in the Québec Infrastructure Plan, in accordance with the *Environment Quality Act* and its regulations.

The question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.
