

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 30 April 2024, on the motion moved by Ms. Guilbault, Minister of Transport and Sustainable Mobility, for the passage of Bill 48, An Act to amend mainly the Highway Safety Code to introduce provisions relating to detection systems and other highway safety-related provisions.

Accordingly, Bill 48 was passed.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, together with Mr. Roberge, Minister Responsible for Canadian Relations and the Canadian Francophonie, and Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), moved:

THAT the National Assembly denounce the federal government's recent encroachments on Québec's areas of jurisdiction;

THAT it denounce the New Democratic Party, the Conservative Party of Canada and the Liberal Party of Canada's refusal to recognize the principle of respect for Québec's areas of jurisdiction and to grant Québec the right to opt out with full compensation in a recent vote in the House of Commons of Canada;

THAT it affirm that the federal government's spending power is contrary to the spirit of the Canadian Constitution and limits Québec's ability to make its own choices.

The question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

THAT the National Assembly declare that public transit is one of the State's missions.

The question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

- the Committee on Public Finance, to undertake clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 30, An Act to amend various provisions mainly with respect to the financial sector.

Business Having Precedence

Estimates of Expenditure

The Assembly entered upon the limited debate on the reports from the committees that examined the estimates of expenditure for the fiscal year ending 31 March 2025.

Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time with respect to this limited debate: 58 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 31 minutes 4 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 20 minutes 34 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 6 minutes 51 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to each independent Member. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded and the Assembly having disposed of the motions stating a grievance and the motion by the Minister of Finance, that the Assembly approve the Government's budgetary policy, moved within the framework of the budget speech, the question was put for concurrence in the several reports together from the committees that examined the estimates of expenditure for the fiscal year ending 31 March 2025, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Marissal (Rosemont) moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that the longterm viability and quality of health care in Québec requires a strong public health system with the means to attract and retain caregivers.

Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; 48 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 24 minutes 9 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 28 minutes 21 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 6 minutes to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to each independent Member. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

Government Bills

Passage

Mr. Roberge, Minister Responsible for Laicity, moved the passage of Bill 52, An Act to enable the Parliament of Québec to preserve the principle of parliamentary sovereignty with respect to the Act respecting the laicity of the State.

After debate thereon, the question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, the division on the motion moved by Mr. Roberge, Minister Responsible for Laicity, was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Thursday, 2 May 2024 at 9:40 a.m.
