

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Prass (D'Arcy-McGee), together with Mr. Skeete, Minister Responsible for the Fight Against Racism, Mr. Cliche-Rivard (Saint-Henri–Sainte-Anne), Mr. Paradis (Jean-Talon), Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil) and Mr. Lefebvre (Arthabaska), moved:

THAT the National Assembly underline Yom HaShoah, or Holocaust Remembrance Day, observed on 5 and 6 May 2024.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the request of Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), together with Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine), moved a motion on National Mental Health Week; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, together with Mr. Fortin (Pontiac), Ms. Ghazal (Mercier) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on young people's screen time; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Charette, Minister of the Environment, the Fight Against Climate Change, Wildlife and Parks, together with Ms. Dufour (Mille-Îles) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly strongly and fully condemn the acts of violence and sabotage and the threats against Northvolt and one of its subcontractors;

THAT it underline its support for the workers involved and recall the importance of the peaceful manner in which debates must take place;

THAT, lastly, it recall that Québec has one of the world's most rigorous environmental assessment frameworks.

The question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

— the Committee on Health and Social Services shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss its observations, conclusions and recommendations following the special consultations, public hearings and meetings held within the framework of the order of initiative on examining ways to facilitate organ and tissue donation, in particular the adoption of presumed consent.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 8 May 2024, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Morin (Acadie).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recall that in a free and democratic society, no person should condemn citizens or organizations for going to court when they consider that their rights have been infringed;

THAT it recall that the rule of law is one of the foundations of Québec democracy.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 236, Ms. Laforest, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, moved that Bill 57, An Act to enact the Act to protect elected officers and to facilitate the unhindered exercise of their functions and to amend various legislative provisions concerning municipal affairs, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 57, An Act to enact the Act to protect elected officers and to facilitate the unhindered exercise of their functions and to amend various legislative provisions concerning municipal affairs, was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, moved that Bill 57 be referred to the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Finance on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 30, An Act to amend various provisions mainly with respect to the financial sector.

After debate, the report was concurred in.

At 5:11 p.m., at the request of Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 6:30 p.m.

Debates upon Adjournment

At 6:32 p.m., the Assembly held a debate upon adjournment on a question from Mr. Fortin (Pontiac) to Mr. Dubé, Minister of Health, about the Government's health care failures. Ms. Bélanger, Minister Responsible for Seniors, replaced the Minister for this debate.

At 6:45 p.m., Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Wednesday, 8 May 2024 at 9:40 a.m.
