**THAT** the National Assembly censure the Coalition avenir Québec government and the Minister of Education for its 2025–2026 budget, which does not meet the enormous challenges in the education system that are undermining student success, such as labour shortages, dilapidated schools and the three-tiered system causing school segregation.
