Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 22 April 2025, on the motion moved by Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister Responsible for Canadian Relations.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly note that the power to appoint judges of the superior courts of the federated States is incumbent on the Governor General under section 96 of the *Constitution Act, 1867*;

THAT the Assembly note that the exercise of such power is circumscribed, as concerns Québec, by the condition that judges be selected from the members of the Barreau du Québec under section 98 of the same Act;

THAT the Assembly note that the purpose of section 98 of the *Constitution Act, 1867* is to ensure that the judges of the superior courts in Québec are versed in the law that is in force there;

THAT the Assembly emphasize that Québec is the only State with a civil law tradition within the federation;

THAT the Assembly consider it advisable to protect and promote that tradition by further defining the conditions of appointment provided for in section 98;

THAT the Assembly underscore that such an amendment may be made by proclamation issued by the Governor General under the Great Seal of Canada where so authorized by resolutions of the National Assembly, the Senate and House of Commons in accordance with section 43 of the *Constitution Act, 1982*;

THAT the Assembly specify that such amendment in no way constitutes recognition by the National Assembly of the *Constitution Act, 1982*, which was adopted without its consent;

THAT the National Assembly authorize the amendment of the Constitution of Canada by proclamation issued by the Governor General under the Great Seal of Canada, in accordance with the following:

AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF CANADA
CONSTITUTION ACT, 1867

1. The Constitution Act, 1867 is amended by replacing section 98 by the following section:

“**98Q.1.** The Judges of the Superior Courts of Quebec shall be selected from the members of the Barreau du Québec recommended by the Government of Quebec.”

2. Name of this amendment: “Constitution Amendment, (year of proclamation) (Quebec)”.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister of Justice, together with Mr. Morin (Acadie), Mr. Paradis (Jean-Talon) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that the *Act to amend the Criminal Code and the Controlled Drugs and Substance Act*, better known as Bill C-5, goes against the efforts made to restore victims' confidence in the justice system and that it constitutes a setback in the fight against sexual assault;

THAT it reiterate that sexual offences are grievous actions that leave permanent marks on the lives of victims, and that the sentences imposed must reflect the seriousness of the acts committed;

THAT it recall that the National Assembly unanimously spoke out, on 15 February 2023, against granting community sentences for sexual assault offences;

THAT it underscore the increasing number of sex offenders serving community sentences at the expense of the safety of Quebecers and, in particular, of victims;

THAT it ask the federal party leaders to firmly commit to quickly amending the *Criminal Code* to make community sentences inadmissible for sexual assault offences once the next federal government is formed.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, together with Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister Responsible for Canadian Relations, Mr. Tanguay, Leader of the Official Opposition, Ms. Ghazal, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly take note that the federal government is granting a total of \$3.75 billion in early carbon rebate funded by all Québec and Canadian taxpayers, despite the abolition of the carbon tax;

THAT it note that Quebecers are not entitled to these election cheques;

THAT the National Assembly ask the federal parties to commit to giving Québec its share of this payment, estimated at more than \$800 million, without conditions.

THAT it acknowledge that this poor financial management resulted in the agency Standard & Poor's downgrading Québec's credit rating, which will lead to increased debt service costs;

THAT it note that this severely restricts the Québec government's capacity to adequately address the numerous challenges it faces;

THAT it recognize that this constitutes a bleak legacy for future generations;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly denounce the deterioration of Québec's public finances under the governance of the Premier and the Minister of Finance.

Ms. D'Amours, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; 53 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 28 minutes 14 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 17 minutes 50 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 7 minutes 26 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to each independent Member. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.
