Appropriation Bills

By leave of the Assembly, Ms. LeBel, Minister Responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, moved the introduction, passage in principle and passage of Bill 102, Appropriation Act No. 2, 2025–2026.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

(Division No. 476 in Appendix)

Yeas: **75** Nays: **28** Abstentions: **0**

Accordingly, Bill 102, Appropriation Act No. 2, 2025–2026, was passed.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 21 May 2025, on the motion moved by Ms. Zaga Mendez (Verdun) during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge that, according to a Léger poll, 72% of Quebecers support the idea of further taxing the rich to adequately fund public services;

THAT it recognize that it is imperative to protect the population from budget cuts in health, education and essential services;

THAT, lastly, it ask the Québec government to examine the possibility of creating a wealth tax, which would affect 0.1% of the richest members of our society, or approximately 4,000 households.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve) moved a motion on the gasoline tax and carbon pricing; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine), together with Mr. Fortin (Pontiac), Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil) and Mr. Chassin (Saint-Jérôme), moved a motion on access to resources and health services provided in the Centre-du-Québec region; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Lemieux (Saint-Jean), together with Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve) and Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), moved:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge the recent declarations by the Prime Minister of the United Kingdom, underlining the importance of protecting the national language;

THAT it recall that Québec is a Francophone nation and that the French language constitutes the basis of the identity, culture and history of the Québec nation;

THAT it recall that every nation has a duty to protect its national language;

THAT it deplore any leniency with regard to the decline of the French language and any hesitation to take action to reverse the linguistic decline on Québec territory.

Passage in Principle

Passage in Principle

Mr. Girard, Minister of Finance, moved that Bill 92, An Act to amend various provisions mainly with respect to the financial sector, do now pass in principle.

The motion was carried, and Bill 92 was accordingly passed in principle.
