THAT today the National Assembly mark International Day of Action for Women's Health, which recalls the fundamental importance of guaranteeing fair, safe and quality access to health care for all women;

THAT it recall that reproductive health, including the right to abortion, contraception and sexual health services, constitutes an essential pillar of women's health, and that these rights must be firmly safeguarded in a context where anti-choice movements aim to undermine them;

THAT, lastly, it encourage the Government to promote a transpartisan approach to improve women's health in Québec.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Ms. LeBel, Minister Responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, moved that Bill 100, An Act respecting the negotiation and determination of conditions of employment requiring national coordination in particular in the public and parapublic sector, do now pass in principle.
