### **Deferred Divisions**

After consultation with the opposition parties and the independent Members, Mr. Legault, Premier, moved the following:

THAT, in accordance with sections 5 and 5.2 of the *Anti-Corruption Act* (chapter L-6.1), Mr. Vincent Richer, Assistant Director, Organizational Services Division, Service de police de la Ville de Montréal, be appointed Anti-Corruption Commissioner for a seven-year term effective 25 June 2025.

The question was put on this motion and, for the purposes of section 5 of the *Anti-Corruption Act*, an electronic division requiring the approval of two thirds of the Members of the National Assembly was held thereupon.

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By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Bonnardel, Minister of Public Security, together with Mr. Paradis (Jean-Talon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly strongly condemn the wave of extortion and criminal threats targeting businesses in the greater Montréal region;

THAT it express its solidarity with the victims of these crimes and with all merchants who contribute every day to the vitality of the metropolis;

THAT it affirm its unwavering support for the police officers who maintain their efforts to fight organized crime and ensure the safety of all Québec citizens;

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THAT it encourage any victim of extortion to immediately communicate with law enforcement;

THAT it acknowledge that convicts incarcerated in correctional facilities and federal penitentiaries continue their activities from within their cells;

THAT it recall the importance of implementing new technological and physical measures in our prisons to prevent criminals from maintaining their criminal network when incarcerated;

THAT it underline the recent measures implemented by the Québec government to fight contraband and the presence of cellphones in correctional facilities;

THAT, lastly, it reiterate that the purpose of detention must be to serve a sentence of imprisonment, not to continue to organize criminal activities.

The question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

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Ms. Setlakwe (Mont-Royal–Outremont), together with Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on the Northvolt project; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

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By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Ghazal, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, together with Ms. Garceau (Robert-Baldwin), Ms. Gentilcore (Terrebonne), Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil) and Mr. Chassin (Saint-Jérôme), moved:

THAT the National Assembly underline the 30th anniversary of the Bread and Roses March, an event that marked the recent history of Québec through the mobilization it inspired, the popular support it garnered, and the gains it achieved for the equality and dignity of Québec women;

THAT it recall that, from 26 May to 4 June 1995, on the initiative of the Fédération des femmes du Québec and in collaboration with many organizations, more than 850 women marched 200 kilometres in 10 days towards the National Assembly to present nine demands to the Government;

THAT it acknowledge the gains made through the Bread and Roses March, including the passage of the *Pay Equity Act*, the establishment of an automatic support-payment collection system, and the retroactive reduction of the sponsorship period from 10 to 3 years for immigrant women already sponsored by their husbands;

THAT it also note that the Bread and Roses March is celebrated worldwide as the catalyst of the World March of Women, which began in 2000 and is still held 25 years later;

THAT it recall that some of the demands made during the Bread and Roses March in 1995 are still relevant today, such as increasing the social housing supply, raising the minimum wage, and supporting autonomous community action;

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THAT it acknowledge that women's motivation to improve both their living conditions and those of the entire population has been demonstrated, since 26 May, through the marches held in 11 regions, as well as the march to be held at the National Assembly on 7 June;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly reiterate its support for the women who continue to march, in 2025, now more than ever, for bread and roses.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried on division and, accordingly, Bill 996 was passed.

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### **Debates on Reports from Committees**

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Select Committee on the Impacts of Screens and Social Media on Young People's Health and Development. The report contains one observation, conclusions and 56 recommendations.

Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this debate: 58 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 30 minutes 10 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 20 minutes to the Second Opposition Group; 8 minutes 20 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to each independent Member. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

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The proceedings resumed at 3:00 p.m.

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The Assembly continued the debate on the consideration of the report from the Select Committee on the Impacts of Screens and Social Media on Young People's Health and Development.

The debate expired and, pursuant to Standing Order 95, no question was put.

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The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 30 May 2025, on the consideration of the report from the Committee on Public Administration, which met on 26 May 2025 to hear the Ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux, the CIUSSS de la Montérégie-Centre, the CIUSSS de l'Estrie-CHUS and the CIUSSS de l'Ouest-de-l'Île-de-Montréal on Chapter 2 of the Auditor General's May 2023 report entitled "Octroi de contrats de gré à gré : en vertu du décret d'urgence sanitaire, ou pour obtenir des places d'hébergement et de la main-d'œuvre indépendante" (Awarding untendered contracts: Under public health emergency orders, or to obtain residential and long term care beds and independent labour). The report contains observations, conclusions and one recommendation.

The debate expired and, pursuant to Standing Order 95, no question was put.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the report, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.
