Opening Speech Debate

The debate being concluded, Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, declared that the motions stating a grievance were receivable, except the motion moved by Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), with respect to which he ruled the following:

RULING FROM THE CHAIR

Pursuant to Standing Order 191, motions stating a grievance can set forth the grounds on which they are based; arguments, on the other hand, are not allowed.

In the past, parliamentary jurisprudence has established that “grounds” is understood to mean the reasons for which a Member censures the Government. “Arguments”, meanwhile, consists of all that tends to support the conclusion sought in the motion. Jurisprudence has shown that explaining the consequences of the actions referred to in the motion stating a grievance is also comparable to arguments.

In light of these criteria, the motion stating a grievance moved by the Member for Laurier-Dorion is to be considered a motion containing arguments.

Indeed, it is similar in form and wording to other motions stating a grievance that were declared out of order by the Chair in the past, notably in rulings made on 11 June 2003, 21 April 2015, 20 April 2021, 8 December 2022 and 27 March 2024.

On behalf of the Member concerned, Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, requested that the Assembly grant leave to replace the aforementioned unreceivable motion by a new motion that complies with the Standing Orders; this motion could not be tabled for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, then proceeded to put the question on the motions stating a grievance moved during the debate and on the motion moved by Mr. Legault, Premier, that the Assembly approve the Government’s general policy; electronic divisions were thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, the electronic divisions were deferred until Routine Proceedings of the sitting.

At 11:50 a.m., at the request of Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 1:40 p.m.

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Ms. Setlakwe (Mont-Royal–Outremont). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its accumulation of cost overruns and delays in State digital transformation projects.

THAT the National Assembly condemn the CAQ government's evident disengagement with regard to the environment, as illustrated by the abolition of key positions, the reduction of environmental inspections, and the weakening of assessment mechanisms for industrial projects, all in the middle of a climate crisis.

THAT the National Assembly censure the CAQ government for the inconsistency between its “law and order” speech and the underfunding of the criminal and penal justice system.

Yeas: **34** Nays: **70** Abstentions: **1**

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Ms. Rotiroti (Jeanne-Mance–Viger). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its weak and incoherent management of infrastructure projects in a context where, despite so-called “historic” investment announcements, the reality on the ground and for the population is very different.
