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Presenting Reports from Committees

Mr. Tanguay (LaFontaine), Committee Chair, tabled the following:

The report from the Committee on Culture and Education, which met on 5 June 2025; and on 8, 9, 21, 22 and 23 October 2025 for clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 94, An Act to, in particular, reinforce laicity in the education network and to amend various legislative provisions. The report contains amendments to the bill.

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

At the request of the President, Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, withdrew certain comments deemed unparliamentary.

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Motions Without Notice

Pursuant to Standing Order 26.1, Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Government House Leader, moved:

THAT, in order to proceed with the introduction and all stages of consideration of Bill 2, An Act mainly to establish collective responsibility with respect to improvement of access to medical services and to ensure continuity of provision of those services, the Assembly appoint the hours of meeting as follows:

THAT the Assembly be permitted to sit every day, beginning at 8:00 a.m., until it has concluded consideration of the matter for which it was summoned or until it decides to adjourn its proceedings.

Pursuant to Standing Order 26.1, Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Government House Leader, moved:

THAT, in order to proceed with the introduction and all stages of consideration of Bill 2, An Act mainly to establish collective responsibility with respect to improvement of access to medical services and to ensure continuity of provision of those services, the Assembly establish the exceptional legislative procedure as provided for in Standing Orders 182 to 184.2 and 257.1 to 257.10;

THAT the President be permitted to suspend the proceedings at any time during the sitting at the request of a Minister or Deputy Government House Leader.

At 8:58 a.m., the President suspended the proceedings to allow the Members to examine the bill and motions moved by Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Government House Leader.

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The proceedings resumed at 10:01 a.m.

The President informed the Assembly that the motions moved by Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Government House Leader, were receivable.

Limited Debate

The President informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate on the reasons why the Assembly has been summoned for extraordinary sittings and on both motions moved by the Government House Leader, namely the motion to appoint the times during which the Assembly shall meet and the motion to introduce an exceptional legislative procedure: 55 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 31 minutes 35 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 18 minutes 57 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 9 minutes 28 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to each independent Member. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

At the request of the President, Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys) withdrew certain comments deemed unparliamentary.

The debate continued.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the motion to appoint the hours during which the Assembly shall meet, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 298, Ms. D'Amours, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly that the interpellation scheduled for the day between Ms. Setlakwe (Mont-Royal-Outremont) and Mr. Bélanger, Minister of Cybersecurity and Digital Technology, on the CAQ's numerous failures and fiascos in IT project governance will be held on 28 October 2025 from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.

Introduction of Bills

Mr. Dubé, Minister of Health, moved that leave be granted to introduce the following bill:

- 2 An Act mainly to establish collective responsibility with respect to improvement of access to medical services and to ensure continuity of provision of those services

The motion was carried on division.

Accordingly, Bill 2 was introduced in the Assembly.

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Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Dubé, Minister of Health, moved that Bill 2, An Act mainly to establish collective responsibility with respect to improvement of access to medical services and to ensure continuity of provision of those services, do now pass in principle.

Ms. D'Amours, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this debate: 2 hours 15 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 1 hour 18 minutes 57 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 47 minutes 22 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 23 minutes 41 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 5 minutes to each independent Member. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Yeas: **60** Nays: **27** Abstentions: **0**

Accordingly, Bill 2 was passed in principle.

At 5:51 p.m., Ms. D'Amours, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings.

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The proceedings resumed at 6:00 p.m.

Committee of the Whole

Pursuant to the order adopted earlier, the Assembly resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole for the clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 2, An Act mainly to establish collective responsibility with respect to improvement of access to medical services and to ensure continuity of provision of those services.

The Committee of the Whole undertook clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 2.

The time allotted to the Committee of the Whole having expired, Bill 2, as amended, was thereupon reported.

At 11:19 p.m., Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings.

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee of the Whole on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 2, An Act mainly to establish collective responsibility with respect to improvement of access to medical services and to ensure continuity of provision of those services, together with the amendments transmitted by Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine).

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The amendments were declared in order.

Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this debate: 27 minutes 45 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 15 minutes 47 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 9 minutes 28 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 4 minutes 44 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 45 seconds to each independent Member. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, put the question on the amendments.

The amendments proposed by Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine), on questions put severally thereon, were negatived.

The sections that the Committee of the Whole had not disposed of and the other components of Bill 2, on questions put severally thereon, were carried on division.

The question was put on the report, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

The report was concurred in on the following vote:

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:
