Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

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At the request of the President, Ms. Ghazal, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 29 October 2025, on the motion moved by Ms. LeBel, Minister of Education, for the passage of Bill 94, An Act to, in particular, reinforce laicity in the education network and to amend various legislative provisions.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

(Division No. 53 in Appendix)

Yeas: **70** Nays: **27** Abstentions: **0**

Accordingly, Bill 94 was passed.

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 29 October 2025, on the motion moved by Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly underline that, 30 years after the 1995 referendum on Québec's accession to sovereignty, Québec's political status has yet to be fully resolved;

THAT it recall that important information on manoeuvres made by the "No" camp are still unavailable to parliamentarians;

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THAT it note that, within the Canadian regime, Québec's political and demographic weight has decreased over the past 30 years;

THAT it note that, within the Canadian regime, the use of French in Québec has declined over the past 30 years;

THAT it note that, within the Canadian regime, the encroachment on Québec's legislative powers has increased over the past 30 years;

THAT it acknowledge that, within the Canadian regime, Québec's social and political development is subject to the supremacy of the Constitution of Canada;

THAT, accordingly, the National Assembly reaffirm that the Québec people are free to assume their destiny and determine their political status.

The motion was negated on the following vote:

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Cliche-Rivard (Saint-Henri–Sainte-Anne) moved a motion on the political engagement of youth; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

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By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Boissonneault (Arthabaska), together with Mr. Dubé, Minister of Health, moved:

THAT the National Assembly deplore Ontario's unacceptable acts of raiding and interference in an attempt to acquire human resources from Québec's health network;

THAT the National Assembly condemn the words of the Ontario Premier, who called on Québec physicians to leave the Québec health network and affirmed that he would be personally involved in recruiting Québec physicians.

The question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Yeas: 92 Nays: 0 Abstentions: 0

Mr. Roberge, Minister of Immigration, Francization and Integration, together with Mr. Boissonneault (Arthabaska), moved a motion on the pressure caused by demographic increases on public services; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Tanguay (LaFontaine), together with Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Mr. Chassin (Saint-Jérôme), moved a motion on the organization of a public hearing by the Minister of Health; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Ms. LeBel, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Citizen Relations, to continue its public hearings within the framework of a general consultation on the consultation paper entitled “Planning of Immigration to Québec for the 2026–2029 Period”;
- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 104, An Act to amend various provisions in particular to follow up on certain requests from the municipal sector;
- the Committee on Culture and Education, to continue its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 109, An Act to affirm the cultural sovereignty of Québec and to enact the Act respecting the discoverability of French-language cultural content in the digital environment.

Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, gave the following notices:

- the Committee on Citizen Relations shall hold a deliberative meeting to establish the Committee’s observations, conclusions and recommendations following the general consultation and public hearings on the consultation document entitled “Planning of Immigration to Québec for the 2026–2029 Period”;
- the Committee on Transportation and the Environment shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the possibility of examining a petition on the implementation of concrete measures to address the presence of illegal truckers and ensure a safe road network.
