Mr. Cliche-Rivard, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, together with Mr. Paradis (Jean-Talon), moved a motion on the preservation of the rule of law and democracy; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine), together with Mr. Derraji (Nelligan), Mr. Grandmont (Taschereau) and Mr. Dufour (Abitibi-Est), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recall that Québec set a target to reduce GHG emissions by 37.5% by 2030;

THAT it acknowledge that the transportation sector accounts for the most GHG emissions, with 43% of total emissions;

THAT it recognize that the Écocamionage program has been suspended since 6 September 2024;

THAT it recognize that this suspension had consequences, notably delayed investments and a slowdown in the decarbonization of transportation in Québec;

THAT it note that many stakeholders from the sector, including Propulsion Québec and the Association du camionnage du Québec are requesting the program's renewal to provide clear and predictable incentives;

THAT it note that the program is included in the actions listed in the 2025–2030 Implementation Plan for a total of \$35 million in 2025–2026;

THAT, lastly, it ask the Government to renew the Écocamionage program before the end of 2025.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly note that Québec is experiencing the worst housing crisis in over 30 years, as rents have increased by 47% since 2018;

THAT it underline that the review of the Tribunal administratif du logement's method of calculation, together with tighter regulations respecting lease transfers, may further accelerate rent increases;

THAT it note that too many tenants and families are already living in a state of unsustainable housing insecurity;

THAT, lastly, it ask the Québec government to immediately intervene to ensure there are no rent increases above the inflation rate, unless they are expressly authorized by the Tribunal administratif du logement.
