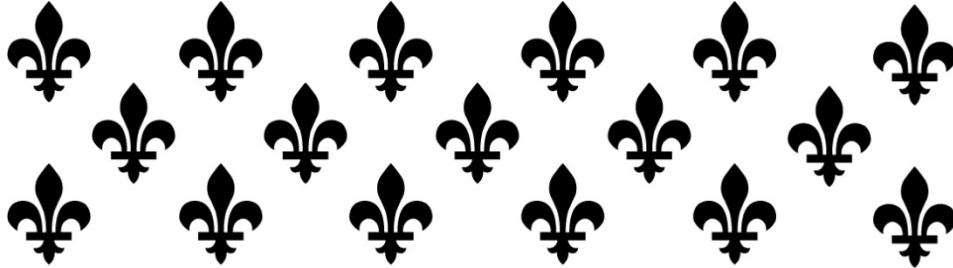

At the request of the President, Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister of Justice, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

Motions Without Notice

Ms. McGraw (Notre-Dame-de-Grâce), together with Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), Mr. Paradis (Jean-Talon), Mr. Dufour (Abitibi-Est), Ms. Blanchette Vézina (Rimouski), Ms. Poulet (Laporte), Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent) and Ms. Lakhoyan Olivier (Chomedey), moved a motion on the joint review of the Canada-United States-Mexico Agreement; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage) moved a motion on the freedom of speech of parliamentarians; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine), together with Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), Ms. Poulet (Laporte), Mr. Marissal (Rosemont) and Ms. Lakhoyan Olivier (Chomedey), moved:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge that the *Police Act* provides that the Minister of Public Security must establish a Québec Police Services Council;

THAT it acknowledge that the Police Services Council has been inactive since 2013;

THAT it recall that the Council advises the Government on all matters relating to police services in Québec;

THAT, accordingly, the National Assembly ask the Minister of Public Security to commit to reinstating the Québec Police Services Council as soon as possible.

The question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Health and Social Services on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 19, An Act to, in particular, improve access to medical services and provide for the medical taking in charge of the population.

Private Members' Public Bills

Passage in Principle

Ms. Grondin (Argenteuil) moved that Bill 496, An Act to recognize the white admiral as the emblematic insect of Québec, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried, and Bill 496 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 496 be referred to the Committee on Culture and Education for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

At 3:59 p.m., at the request of Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 6:30 p.m.

Debates upon Adjournment

At 6:30 p.m., the Assembly held a debate upon adjournment on a question from Ms. McGraw (Notre-Dame-de-Grâce) to Mr. Skeete, Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie, about the lack of leadership of the CAQ government, which has yet to appoint a chief negotiator for Québec.

At 6:44 p.m., Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Wednesday, 25 February 2026 at 9:40 a.m.
