The Assembly was called to order at 10:00 a.m.

Moment of reflection

ORDERS OF THE DAY

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 53, the Assembly proceeded to hear a motion without notice.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, moved:

THAT, pursuant to the provisions of subparagraph 4.1 of the first paragraph of Standing Order 87 and Standing Orders 280 and 281, the Assembly consider and concur in Interim Supply for the 2026–2027 fiscal year as provided hereinafter;

THAT, as soon as Orders of the Day for the 19 March 2026 sitting are called, the Assembly resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole and consider Interim Supply as follows:

THAT, for a period not exceeding 1 hour, an exchange take place between the Minister of Health and the Members in opposition;

THAT, immediately thereafter and for a period not exceeding 1 hour, an exchange take place between the Minister Responsible for Housing and the Members in opposition;

17 March 2026

THAT, at 1:00 p.m., the Committee of the Whole suspend its proceedings and that the proceedings of the Assembly be suspended until 2:00 p.m.;

THAT, at 2:00 p.m., the Committee of the Whole continue its proceedings and, if necessary, be able to conclude the exchange between the Members in opposition and the Minister Responsible for Housing;

THAT, immediately thereafter and for a period not exceeding 1 hour, an exchange take place between the Minister of Education and the Members in opposition;

THAT, immediately thereafter and for a period not exceeding 1 hour, an exchange take place between the Minister of Economy, Innovation and Energy and the Members in opposition;

THAT, immediately thereafter and for a period not exceeding 1 hour, an exchange take place between the Minister of Immigration, Francization and Integration and the Members in opposition;

THAT, immediately upon the conclusion of this exchange, the Chair of the Committee of the Whole put the question for concurrence in one quarter of the estimates of expenditure for the 2026–2027 fiscal year;

THAT the Chair of the Committee of the Whole then report to the Assembly and that the question for concurrence in such report and the question for passage of the consequent appropriation bill be put without debate, pursuant to the first paragraph of Standing Order 281;

THAT, lastly, pursuant to the second paragraph of Standing Order 281, the Government House Leader be permitted to move a motion without notice that may not be debated, stating that the main estimates of expenditure, save those of the National Assembly, be referred to the Standing Committees for consideration;

THAT the opening statements for each of the exchanges not exceed 6 minutes for the parliamentary group forming the Government; 3 minutes for the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 1 minute 50 seconds for the Second Opposition Group; and 1 minute 10 seconds for the Third Opposition Group;

17 March 2026

THAT, for each of the exchanges with the aforementioned ministers, a period of 45 seconds per hour be set aside for exchanges with each independent Member;

THAT any time not used by the independent Members be redistributed proportionally among the parliamentary groups forming the Official Opposition, the Second Opposition Group and the Third Opposition Group;

THAT the President of the Assembly or the Chair of the Committee of the Whole be permitted to suspend the proceedings at any time;

THAT, despite Standing Order 20, the Committee of the Whole and the Assembly be permitted to continue their proceedings until the latter has voted on the appropriation bill and on the motion for referral of all of the estimates of expenditure, save those of the National Assembly, to the Standing Committees for consideration;

THAT this motion become an order of the Assembly and take precedence over any incompatible provisions of the Standing Orders.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

The President gave a directive on modifications in the distribution of certain measures and speaking times during limited debates having become necessary following the election of the Member for Chicoutimi in the by-election of 23 February 2026.

RULING FROM THE CHAIR

As regards Statements by Members, the Third Opposition Group will be granted an additional statement, in 10th place, at the 5th sitting of the cycle, to replace a statement by the parliamentary group forming the Government.

Concerning the allocation of questions for Question Period, the Third Opposition Group will be granted three additional questions per 12-sitting cycle, for a total of 20 questions per cycle. The purpose of this change is to maintain the proportional allocation of questions between the parliamentary opposition groups based on the addition of a Member of the Third Opposition Group, while also respecting the parameters negotiated by the parliamentary groups at the beginning of the legislature.

Lastly, the allocation of speaking time for limited debates is adjusted to take into account the new proportion between parliamentary groups.
