Business Having Precedence

Debate on the Budget Speech

The Assembly entered upon the debate on the motion moved by Mr. Girard, Minister of Finance, that the Assembly approve the Government's budgetary policy.

At the end of his address, Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its 2026–2027 budget, which represents a definitive admission of failure to Quebecers with regard to the control of expenditure and fails to introduce a credible plan for a return to a balanced budget.

The debate continued on the motion moved by Mr. Girard, Minister of Finance, and on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), subject to the receivability of this motion.

24 March 2026

At the beginning of her address, Ms. Zaga Mendez (Verdun) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly censure the Government for the lack of measures in its latest budget to address the rising cost of living and the housing crisis, as well as for its refusal to access new revenues from Quebec's billionaires and multimillionaires, which hampers our public services.

The debate continued on the motion moved by Mr. Girard, Minister of Finance, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys) and Ms. Zaga Mendez (Verdun), subject to the receivability of these motions.

At the end of his address, Mr. Paradis (Jean-Talon) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly censure the CAQ government for tabling a transitory budget, since it is based on an economic vision rejected by the two CAQ leadership candidates aspiring to become premier, whose respective promises are not consistent with that budget;

THAT it deplore the fact that the budget, on the other hand, provides a partisan political fund of \$250 million per year, for a total of \$1.25 billion, that may be used at the discretion of the Member for Lévis or the Member for Sanguinet, depending on whom the CAQ members elect as leader.

The debate continued on the motion moved by Mr. Girard, Minister of Finance, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), Ms. Zaga Mendez (Verdun) and Mr. Paradis (Jean-Talon), subject to the receivability of these motions.

24 March 2026

The President informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this debate: 5 hours 52 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government, including the Budget Speech; 3 hours 7 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition, including the comments made by its representative on 18 March 2026 and his address during the proceedings; 1 hour 56 minutes 15 seconds to the Second Opposition Group, including the comments made by its representative on 18 March 2026, and her address during the proceedings; 1 hour 18 minutes 45 seconds to the Third Opposition Group, including the comments made by its representative on 18 March 2026 and the address by the representative of the leader of that party during this sitting; and 7 minutes 30 seconds to each independent Member. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate continued.

At 12:00 p.m., the President suspended the proceedings until 1:40 p.m.

Accordingly, pursuant to Standing Order 52, the debate on the motion moved by Mr. Girard, Minister of Finance, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), Ms. Zaga Mendez (Verdun) and Mr. Paradis (Jean-Talon), was adjourned in the name of Ms. Hébert (Saint-François).

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge the concerns publicly expressed by the Chief Electoral Officer of Québec with regard to the lack of a legal framework governing the use of artificial intelligence by political parties;

THAT it note the urgent calls from Québec experts to regulate the use of artificial intelligence in politics, in particular with regard to the upcoming election campaign;

THAT it underline that a non-partisan code of conduct has been developed by Québec researchers, particularly based on the principles of transparency, responsible use, data protection and prevention of disinformation;

THAT it recognize that the lack of common rules regarding the use of artificial intelligence by political parties can undermine public trust in the accuracy of online information and, consequently, in our democratic institutions;

THAT, accordingly, the National Assembly ask all political parties represented in this House to immediately adhere to the code of conduct of the research, training and knowledge mobilization consortium in artificial intelligence (IVADO).

Debate on the Budget Speech

THAT the National Assembly denounce the fact that, in a context of geopolitical tensions, commercial uncertainties and the restructuring of international trade as acknowledged by the Government itself, the 2026–2027 budget fails to propose a structured vision or significant investments to reinforce Québec’s presence, credibility and capacity of influence on the international stage.

THAT the National Assembly censure the CAQ government and the Minister Responsible for Housing for significantly reducing investments in the construction of social and community housing in the 2026–2027 budget, which fails to address the magnitude of the housing crisis and meet the needs of the population for truly affordable rent, as well as contributing to the worsening of the homelessness crisis.
