THAT the National Assembly recall that petroleum research and production are no longer allowed in Québec following the passage of the *Act ending exploration for petroleum and underground reservoirs and production of petroleum and brine* in 2022;

THAT, in this regard, it recall the unanimous vote by the Members of the Assembly in favour of this legislation;

THAT it recall the initiatives of citizens and municipal elected officials across Québec, including in Sainte-Luce in the Bas-Saint-Laurent region, to prevent the exploration and exploitation of shale gas on its territory and to protect the water table;

THAT, accordingly, the National Assembly reiterate its opposition to hydraulic fracturing and shale gas development on Québec territory.

THAT the National Assembly strongly denounce the Air Canada CEO's lack of respect for the French language, bereaved Québec families, and all Francophones in the federation;

THAT it underline that this is not the first time Michael Rousseau's behaviour has been seen as an affront with regard to language;

THAT it recall that French is the only common and official language of Québec;

THAT it declare that Air Canada's disappointing response to the situation is incompatible with the legitimate expectations of Quebecers;

THAT the National Assembly call for the resignation of Michael Rousseau as CEO of Air Canada;

THAT the National Assembly reaffirm that the notwithstanding clause, set out in section 33 of the *Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms*, is a fully legitimate tool, embedded in the Constitution, which allows the National Assembly of Québec to exercise its parliamentary sovereignty;

THAT it recall that this clause is an integral part of the Constitution and that its purpose is to ensure balance between the judiciary and the primacy of democratically-elected officials;

THAT it reaffirm Québec's right to use the notwithstanding clause, including in a preventive manner, without interference or restriction from the federal government or any other authority;

THAT it formally denounce any attempt to limit, regulate or neutralize the use of this clause by Québec, in particular through the obsolete and antidemocratic power of disallowance or federal policy initiatives;

THAT, accordingly, it affirm that any calling into question of this fundamental right constitutes a direct attack on Québec's autonomy and ability to legislate according to the democratic choices of its nation.
