### **Oral Questions and Answers**

Mr. Tanguay, Official Opposition House Leader, requested a directive regarding the absence of ministers during Question Period.

#### **RULING FROM THE CHAIR**

The Chair states that Standing Order 189 provides that any minister may act on behalf of another minister. Indeed, it is common for ministers to be replaced by other ministers during parliamentary proceedings, including during Question Period.

The Chair has already noted that no Standing Order requires the presence of a minister during a debate regarding a stage in the consideration of a bill; the same holds true for Question Period. The choice is left to the Executive.

However, as the Chair has already affirmed in other contexts, it is desirable for ministers to be present to ensure the smooth running of parliamentary proceedings. Indeed, one of the fundamental roles of Members is parliamentary oversight, the efficiency of which relies in part on the participation of the members of the Executive.

Nonetheless, it is not the place of the Chair to intervene on this matter at this time.

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

At the request of the President, Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage) withdrew certain comments deemed unparliamentary.

### Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Cliche-Rivard, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, together with Ms. Prass (D'Arcy-McGee), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine), Ms. Poulet (Laporte), Mr. Marissal (Rosemont) and Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent), moved:

THAT the National Assembly express its profound sadness at the passing of Serge and Valmont, on 25 and 26 March 2026 in Montréal, two homeless people who were well-known in their community and whose deaths add to the 108 people experiencing homelessness who died in Québec in 2024;

THAT it recall that the fight against homelessness needs constant efforts and sustained and predictable funding to both meet emergency needs and develop sustainable solutions, in particular social housing;

THAT, accordingly, it severely censure the federal government for its disengagement with regard to funding for the fight against homelessness, and that it request the renewal of essential programs, such as the Community Encampment Response Plan, and an increase in funding for the Reaching Home program;

THAT, lastly, it invite the Members of the National Assembly to observe a minute of silence in memory of all people experiencing homelessness who died.

Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 1 April 2026, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that, in the context of the housing crisis, many tenants do not exercise their rights out of fear that the public nature of the Tribunal administratif du logement records will hinder their search for housing;

THAT it note that this situation jeopardizes access to housing, favours excessive rent increases and contributes to the perpetuation of unhealthy or unsafe housing conditions;

THAT it acknowledge the fact that other provinces, notably British Columbia, Alberta, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, do not make public the names of tenants who exercise their rights;

THAT, lastly, it ask the Québec government to act immediately to anonymize records of tenants found not at fault by the Tribunal administratif du logement.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

#### *Report Stage*

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Finance on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 7, An Act to reduce bureaucracy, increase state efficiency and reinforce the accountability of senior public servants, together with the amendments transmitted by Mr. Grandmont (Taschereau).

The amendments were declared in order.

After debate thereon, the amendments were negatived.

The report was concurred in on division.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Labour and the Economy on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 3, An Act to improve the transparency, governance and democratic process of various associations in the workplace, together with the amendments transmitted by Mr. Chassin (Saint-Jérôme).

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Citizen Relations on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 9, An Act respecting the reinforcement of laicity in Québec.

The debate being concluded, the report was concurred in on division.

---

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 13, An Act to promote the population's safety and sense of security and to amend various provisions, together with the amendment transmitted by Mr. Derraji (Nelligan).

The amendment was declared out of order because it introduces a new principle into the bill.

One of the purposes of the bill is to make changes to the control and oversight of the highway transportation of persons and goods.

The purpose of the amendment is to amend section 202.2.1.2 of the *Highway Safety Code*, which prohibits driving a heavy vehicle with a blood alcohol concentration level equal to or in excess of 50 mg of alcohol in 100 ml of blood. More specifically, the purpose of the amendment is to extend this prohibition to all drivers of road vehicles, on pain of the suspension of their licence for 24 hours. It should be noted that this section of the *Highway Safety Code* on the suspension of licences is not covered by Bill 13.
