Motion moved by the Member for Laurier-Dorion under Standing Order 97:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that, in the context of the housing crisis, many tenants do not exercise their rights out of fear that the public nature of the Tribunal administratif du logement records hinders their search for housing;

THAT it note that this situation jeopardizes access to housing, favours excessive rent increases and contributes to the perpetuation of unhealthy or unsafe housing conditions;

THAT it acknowledge the fact that other provinces, notably British Columbia, Alberta, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, do not make public the names of tenants that exercise their rights;

THAT, lastly, it ask the Québec government to act immediately to anonymize the Tribunal administratif du logement records that concern non-culpable tenants.

**BUSINESS HAVING PRECEDENCE**

- (1) Pursuant to Standing Orders 275 and 276, continuation of the debate on the motion by the Minister of Finance, –That this Assembly approve the budgetary policy of the Government,

And on the motions stating a grievance moved by:

**The Member for Marguerite-Bourgeoys:**

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its 2026–2027 budget, which represents a definitive admission of failure to Quebecers with regard to the control of expenditure and fails to introduce a credible plan for a return to a balanced budget.

**The Member for Verdun:**

THAT the National Assembly censure the Government for the lack of measures in its latest budget to address the rising cost of living and the housing crisis, as well as for its refusal to access new revenues from Quebec’s millionaires and multimillionaires, which hampers our public services.

**The Member for Jean-Talon:**

THAT the National Assembly censure the CAQ government for tabling a transitory budget, since it is based on an economic vision rejected by the two CAQ leadership candidates aspiring to become premier, whose respective promises are not consistent with that budget;

THAT it deplore the fact that the budget, on the other hand, provides a partisan political fund of \$250 million per year, for a total of \$1.25 billion, that may be used at the discretion of the Member for Lévis or the Member for Sanguinet, depending on whom the CAQ members elect as leader.

**The Member for Notre-Dame-de-Grâce:**

THAT the National Assembly denounce the fact that, in a context of geopolitical tensions, commercial uncertainties and the restructuring of international trade as acknowledged by the Government itself, the 2026–2027 budget fails to propose a structured vision or significant investments to reinforce Québec’s presence, credibility and capacity of influence on the international stage.

**The Member for Laurier-Dorion:**

THAT the National Assembly censure the CAQ government and the Minister Responsible for Housing for significantly reducing investments in the construction of social and community housing in the 2026–2027 budget, which fails to address the magnitude of the housing crisis and meet the needs of the population for truly affordable rent, as well as contributing to the worsening of the homelessness crisis.

**The Member for D’Arcy-McGee:**

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its 2026–2027 budget, which fails to address the real needs in the areas of prevention and frontline services required to tackle the homelessness crisis and the growing demand for mental health care.

**The Member for Taschereau:**

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Government for its lack of ambition and consistency in the fight against climate change and for its implicit support for projects that are incompatible with the protection of the environment and biodiversity in the budget tabled the Minister of Finance;

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Government for the chronic underfunding of the community sector, which jeopardizes its workers who single-handedly keep a sizable proportion of Quebecers’ social safety net afloat.

**The Member for La Pinière:**

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its 2026–2027 budget, which does not provide any measures to support existing intermediate resources or to develop new facilities that are essential for the most vulnerable people.

**The Member for Mont-Royal–Outremont:**

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its 2026–2027 budget which, despite the Government’s commitment, still does not provide remuneration for all mandatory internships in the public sector.

**The Leader of the Second Opposition Group:**

THAT the National Assembly censure the CAQ government for providing in the 2026-2027 budget a sum of \$250 million for the next five years to be used by the next person to be elected Leader of the Coalition Avenir Québec and Premier of Québec.

**The Leader of the Official Opposition:**

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its 2026–2027 budget, which does not meet the expectations of Quebecers and contains no adequate responses to the issues they face in their daily lives with regard to the cost of living and access to public services.

**The Member for Arthabaska:**

THAT the National Assembly censure the CAQ government for its inability to provide adequate financial support to our farmers.

**The Member for Nelligan:**

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for letting major establishments like the Hôpital Maisonneuve-Rosemont deteriorate due to a lack of clear financial commitment, after eight years of management marked by delays and inaction.

**The Member for Hochelaga-Maisonneuve:**

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for abandoning the ideal of Québec being a province crazy about its children by refusing to prioritize the completion of our childcare centre network in its last eight years in office.

**The Member for Jacques-Cartier:**

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for tabling a 2026–2027 budget that does not meet young people’s needs and that lacks vision for future generations.

**The Member for Saint-Henri–Sainte-Anne:**

THAT the National Assembly censure the CAQ government and the Minister of Health and Social Services for delaying the construction of the new Hôpital Maisonneuve-Rosemont for the 14th year in a row, and for causing a decline in access to health care and services in our public institutions as a result of drastic austerity cuts, a hiring freeze for administrative personnel and the privatization of public services.

**The Member for Mille-Îles:**

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for a budget that confines itself to the announcement of 1,000 affordable housing units over three years, which is in no way commensurate with actual needs, and for its inability to ensure adequate funding for the Residential Adaptation Assistance Program.

**The Member for Acadie:**

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its inability to increase the number of prosecutors and administrative personnel to ensure efficient legal proceedings, and for its delays in the digital transformation of the justice system.

**The Member for Westmount–Saint-Louis:**

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its 2026–2027 budget, which does not meet the real needs on the ground to face the rise of violence and crimes in Québec.

**The Member for Jean-Lesage:**

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Coalition avenir Québec government for its disengagement from legislative reconciliation with the Anishinaabe, Atikamekw Nehirowisiw, Eeyou, Innu, Inuit, Kanien'kehá:ka, Mi'gmaq, Naskapi, W8banaki, Wendat and Wolastoqiyik nations by refusing to adopt legislation on the application of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples.

**The Member for Robert-Baldwin:**

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for the 2026–2027 budget, which does not address the urgency of the domestic violence issue, neglects adequate support for women's shelters, second-stage shelters, and the development of new housing units, and jeopardizes sufficient, safe and adapted access to services for women who are victims throughout Québec.

**The Member for Maurice-Richard:**

THAT the National Assembly censure the CAQ government and the Minister of Economy, Innovation and Energy for its budget, which does not include measures to nationalize wind farms or significant investments in the ecological transition, and which deprives Québec of strategic levers and vital State revenues in a context where major investments in clean and public energy are both an ecological necessity and a major economic opportunity for Québec.

**The Member for Marquette:**

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its 2026–2027 budget and its lack of planning and vision for the community sector.

**The Member for Sherbrooke:**

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for not making the investments required to implement the urgent shift toward home care and support services, as recommended by the Health and Welfare Commissioner, to adequately respond to the colossal issues stemming from the aging of Québec's population.

**The Official Opposition House Leader:**

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its budget, which once again reveals that the CAQ has abandoned our Capitale-Nationale region, in particular due to the lack of achievements with regard to infrastructure.

To the Minister of the Environment, the Fight Against Climate Change, Wildlife and Parks

An article published last year in *La Terre de chez nous* revealed that the use of certain plastics contributes to the accumulation of microplastics in the soil, which may then end up in ecosystems and, ultimately, in the food chain.

These plastics, which are sometimes described as “biodegradable”, do not really decompose, but instead break down into fine, persistent particles. This situation raises concerns and calls for a reflection on how they are regulated.

During the clause-by-clause consideration of the Ministère de l’Environnement’s budget estimates last year, I raised this issue with the Minister and asked him whether these plastics would be prohibited. The Minister then indicated that he would consider the matter and get back with a response.

However, since that exchange, no response has been provided.

In this context, can the Minister tell us whether he intends to further regulate the use of so-called “biodegradable” plastics that break down into microplastics, and specify the actions his department plans to take to better protect the soil and environment?
