The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

At the request of the President, Ms. Bélanger, Minister of Health, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 1 April 2026, on the motion moved by Mr. Roberge, Minister Responsible for Laicity, for the passage of Bill 9, An Act respecting the reinforcement of laicity in Québec.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

(Division No. 140 in Appendix)

Yeas: 77 Nays: 27 Abstentions: 0

Accordingly, Bill 9 was passed.

2 April 2026

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 1 April 2026, on the motion moved by Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion) during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that, in the context of the housing crisis, many tenants do not exercise their rights out of fear that the public nature of the Tribunal administratif du logement records will hinder their search for housing;

THAT it note that this situation jeopardizes access to housing, favours excessive rent increases and contributes to the perpetuation of unhealthy or unsafe housing conditions;

THAT it acknowledge the fact that other provinces, notably British Columbia, Alberta, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, do not make public the names of tenants who exercise their rights;

THAT, lastly, it ask the Québec government to act immediately to anonymize records of tenants found not at fault by the Tribunal administratif du logement.

The motion was negated on the following vote:

Then, the Premier made a statement.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Lévesque (Chapleau), together with Mr. Morin (Acadie), Mr. Bouazzi (Maurice-Richard), Mr. Paradis (Jean-Talon), Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent) and Ms. Lakhoyan Olivier (Chomedey), moved:

THAT the National Assembly underline the important work carried out by the Société québécoise d'information juridique (SOQUIJ), which has contributed to the accessibility of law and justice for all Quebecers for the past 50 years;

THAT it recall that SOQUIJ works to disseminate and promote Québec law in the official language of the judiciary, French, through the publication of jurisprudence and its judgment translation services;

THAT it recognize SOQUIJ's contribution to the democratization and modernization of the law, in particular through the development of technological tools, such as the JuridiQC legal information platform;

THAT it also underline the essential support SOQUIJ provides to numerous key partners in the legal ecosystem, to make justice increasingly accessible to all Quebecers;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly solemnly mark the 50th anniversary of SOQUIJ and that it reaffirm its support for the mission of this institution, which is essential to the entire population of Québec.

Debate on the Budget Speech

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 26 March 2026, on the motion moved by Mr. Girard, Minister of Finance, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), Ms. Zaga Mendez (Verdun), Mr. Paradis (Jean-Talon), Ms. McGraw (Notre-Dame-de-Grâce), Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), Ms. Prass (D'Arcy-McGee), Mr. Grandmont (Taschereau), Ms. Caron (La Pinière), Ms. Setlakwe (Mont-Royal–Outremont), Ms. Ghazal, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Fortin, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Boissonneault (Arthabaska), Mr. Derraji (Nelligan), Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), Mr. Kelley (Jacques-Cartier), Mr. Cliche-Rivard (Saint-Henri–Sainte-Anne), Ms. Dufour (Mille-Îles), Mr. Morin (Acadie), Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage), Ms. Garceau (Robert-Baldwin), Mr. Bouazzi (Maurice-Richard), Mr. Ciccone (Marquette), Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke) and Mr. Tanguay, Official Opposition House Leader, subject to the receivability of these motions.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 276, Ms. Zaga Mendez (Verdun) commented on behalf of the Second Opposition Group.

The debate being concluded, Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, declared that the motions stating a grievance were receivable, except the motion moved by Mr. Grandmont (Taschereau), with respect to which she ruled the following:

RULING FROM THE CHAIR

Pursuant to Standing Order 274, during this debate, every Member may speak once and move a motion stating a grievance or a want of confidence motion.

During his address, the Member for Taschereau indicated his intent to move two motions stating a grievance, which he then proceeded to read consecutively. The Chair then informed him that he could only move one motion, and that he would have to reformulate his motions if he wished to move one motion addressing both issues. However, the Member for Taschereau instead reread his two motions in full and sent a file in which the two motions were placed one after the other.

The fact that the two motions have been combined into a single document does not mean that they no longer constitute two distinct motions that are completely independent of one another and address entirely different issues.

Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, then proceeded to put the question on the motions stating a grievance moved during the debate and on the motion moved by Mr. Girard, Minister of Finance, that the Assembly approve the budgetary policy of the Government; electronic divisions were thereupon demanded.

First, the question was put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its 2026–2027 budget, which represents a definitive admission of failure to Quebecers with regard to the control of expenditure and fails to introduce a credible plan for a return to a balanced budget.

The motion was negated on the following vote:

(Division No. **147** in Appendix)

Yeas: **20** Nays: **50** Abstentions: **0**

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Ms. Zaga Mendez (Verdun). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly censure the Government for the lack of measures in its latest budget to address the rising cost of living and the housing crisis, as well as for its refusal to access new revenues from Quebec's billionaires and multimillionaires, which hampers our public services.

The motion was negated on the following vote:

(Division No. **148** in Appendix)

Yeas: **3** Nays: **68** Abstentions: **0**

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Paradis (Jean-Talon). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly censure the CAQ government for tabling a transitory budget, since it is based on an economic vision rejected by the two CAQ leadership candidates aspiring to become premier, whose respective promises are not consistent with that budget;

THAT it deplore the fact that the budget, on the other hand, provides a partisan political fund of \$250 million per year, for a total of \$1.25 billion, that may be used at the discretion of the Member for Lévis or the Member for Sanguinet, depending on whom the CAQ members elect as leader.

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Ms. McGraw (Notre-Dame-de-Grâce). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly denounce the fact that, in a context of geopolitical tensions, commercial uncertainties and the restructuring of international trade as acknowledged by the Government itself, the 2026–2027 budget fails to propose a structured vision or significant investments to reinforce Québec's presence, credibility and capacity of influence on the international stage.

2 April 2026

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion). This motion reads as follows:

THA the National Assembly censure the CAQ government and the Minister Responsible for Housing for significantly reducing investments in the construction of social and community housing in the 2026–2027 budget, which fails to address the magnitude of the housing crisis and meet the needs of the population for truly affordable rent, as well as contributing to the worsening of the homelessness crisis.

The motion was negated on the following vote:

Yeas: **18** Nays: **54** Abstentions: **0**

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Ms. Prass (D’Arcy-McGee). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its 2026–2027 budget, which fails to address the real needs for prevention and frontline services required to tackle the homelessness crisis and the growing demand for mental health care.

The motion was negated on the following vote:

Yeas: **19** Nays: **52** Abstentions: **0**

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Ms. Caron (La Pinière). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its 2026–2027 budget, which does not provide any measures to support existing intermediate resources or to develop new facilities that are essential for the most vulnerable people.

The motion was negated on the following vote:

(Division No. **153** in Appendix)

Yeas: **18** Nays: **54** Abstentions: **0**

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Ms. Setlakwe (Mont-Royal–Outremont). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its 2026–2027 budget which, despite the Government’s commitment, still does not provide remuneration for all mandatory internships in the public sector.

The motion was negated on the following vote:

Yeas: **19** Nays: **54** Abstentions: **0**

2 April 2026

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Ms. Ghazal, Leader of the Second Opposition Group. This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly censure the CAQ government for allocating \$250 million in the 2026–2027 budget over the next five years to be used by the next elected leader of the Coalition Avenir Québec and Premier of Québec.

The motion was negated on the following vote:

Yeas: **19** Nays: **54** Abstentions: **0**

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Fortin, Leader of the Official Opposition. This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its 2026–2027 budget, which does not meet the expectations of Quebecers and contains no adequate responses to the issues they face in their daily lives with regard to the cost of living and access to public services.

The motion was negated on the following vote:

Yeas: **21** Nays: **52** Abstentions: **0**

2 April 2026

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Boissonneault (Arthabaska). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly censure the CAQ government for its inability to provide adequate financial support to our farmers.

The motion was negated on the following vote:

(Division No. **157** in Appendix)

Yeas: **19** Nays: **53** Abstentions: **1**

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Derraji (Nelligan). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for letting major establishments like the Hôpital Maisonneuve-Rosemont deteriorate due to a lack of clear financial commitment, after eight years of management marked by delays and inaction.

The motion was negated on the following vote:

Yeas: **19** Nays: **52** Abstentions: **2**

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for abandoning the ideal of Québec being a province crazy about its children by refusing to prioritize the completion of our childcare centre network in its last eight years in office.

The motion was negated on the following vote:

Yeas: **19** Nays: **54** Abstentions: **0**

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Kelley (Jacques-Cartier). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for tabling a 2026–2027 budget that does not meet young people’s needs and that lacks vision for future generations.

The motion was negated on the following vote:

(Division No. **160** in Appendix)

Yeas: **20** Nays: **53** Abstentions: **0**

2 April 2026

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Cliche-Rivard (Saint-Henri–Sainte-Anne). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly censure the CAQ government and the Minister of Health and Social Services for delaying the construction of the new Hôpital Maisonneuve-Rosemont for the 14th year in a row, and for causing a decline in access to health care and services in our public institutions as a result of drastic austerity cuts, a hiring freeze for administrative personnel and the privatization of public services.

The motion was negated on the following vote:

Yeas: **7** Nays: **52** Abstentions: **13**

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Ms. Dufour (Mille-Îles). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for a budget that confines itself to the announcement of 1,000 affordable housing units over three years, which is in no way commensurate with actual needs, and for its inability to ensure adequate funding for the Residential Adaptation Assistance Program.

The motion was negated on the following vote:

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Morin (Acadie). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its inability to increase the number of prosecutors and administrative personnel to ensure efficient legal proceedings, and for its delays in the digital transformation of the justice system.

The motion was negated on the following vote:

Yeas: **21** Nays: **51** Abstentions: **0**

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its 2026–2027 budget, which does not meet the real needs on the ground to face the rise of violence and crimes in Québec.

The motion was negated on the following vote:

(Division No. **164** in Appendix)

Yeas: **19** Nays: **52** Abstentions: **1**
