## Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Paradis (Jean-Talon), together with Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage) and Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recall that the First Nations Education Council asked the Government to reserve at least one seat on the board of directors of the Institut national d'excellence en éducation (INEÉ) to a person from an Indigenous community;

THAT it recall that, for this purpose, the First Nations Education Council submitted to the Government a list of candidates, none of whom were selected;

THAT it acknowledge the provisions of the *Act respecting the Institut national d'excellence en éducation* and the *Act respecting the governance of state-owned enterprises*, in particular those respecting the representation of the diversity of Québec society in the boards of directors of state-owned enterprises;

THAT the National Assembly recall the importance of First Nations and Inuit representation on the board of directors of the INEÉ and of reinforcing the ability to consider the unique realities of the First Nations and the Inuit with regard to education.

THAT it acknowledge the concerns about the possible use of artificial intelligence and surveillance pricing in the food sector;

THAT it stress that, in a context in which the rising cost of living already weighs heavily on Québec households, any practice likely to make food prices vary from one consumer to the next based on consumers' personal data should be the subject of careful reflection;

THAT, accordingly, it ask the Québec government to shed light on these practices, in partnership with the Office de la protection du consommateur, and take the necessary measures to protect Québec consumers from surveillance pricing in the food sector.
