Motions Without Notice

Ms. Mallette (Huntingdon), together with Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, Mr. Chassin (Saint-Jérôme) and Mr. Dufour (Abitibi-Est), moved a motion on the tax rate for Quebecers; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

14 May 2026

Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), together with Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine), Mr. Dufour (Abitibi-Est), Ms. Poulet (Laporte) and Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), moved a motion on mental health support for public security professionals; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), together with Ms. Biron, Minister Responsible for the Status of Women, Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), Ms. Gentilcore (Terrebonne), Mr. Chassin (Saint-Jérôme), Ms. Poulet (Laporte) and Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 24th edition of the International Day Against Homophobia and Transphobia, an initiative launched in 2003 by Québec organization Fondation Émergence, to be held on 17 May 2026;

THAT it also underline Fondation Émergence’s public awareness campaign, under the theme “The Allied Effect is on the move”, which highlights the importance of allies in building a more inclusive and respectful society;

THAT it recognize the essential role of allies, whether they are individuals, institutions or organizations, in making sure that sexually and gender diverse people are treated with respect and dignity, and live in safety;

THAT it acknowledge the growing concerns related to hate speech and hateful acts aimed at sexually and gender diverse people, both in Québec and across the world;

THAT it invite the Québec population to participate in the initiatives deployed as part of 17 May, to take action in solidarity with sexually and gender diverse people, and to contribute to the Ally Effect by recalling that each action taken in support helps build a more compassionate society;

THAT, lastly, it reaffirm Québec’s role as a leader in the fight against homophobia and transphobia, as well as its commitment to promote equality, dignity and respect for all.

14 May 2026

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.
