Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Cliche-Rivard, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, together with Mr. Carmant, Minister Responsible for Social Services and the Fight Against Homelessness, Ms. Garceau (Robert-Baldwin), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine), Ms. Blanchette Vézina (Rimouski), Ms. Poulet (Laporte), Mr. Marissal (Rosemont) and Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recall the tragic death of the little girl from Granby on 30 April 2019, which profoundly shocked Québec and led to the creation of the Special Commission on the Rights of the Child and Youth Protection, known as the Laurent Commission, which made 65 calls to action consisting of 250 recommendations to transform youth protection in Québec;

THAT it underline that the establishment of the position of Commissioner for Children's Well-Being and Rights, who tabled her first report on 14 May 2026, was born out of that commission's first recommendation;

THAT it acknowledge that the conclusions of the Laurent Commission were widely recognized and applauded;

THAT, accordingly, pursuant to the mechanism provided for in the *Act respecting the Commissioner for Children's Well-Being and Rights*, the National Assembly mandate the Commissioner to assess the implementation of these calls to action and to make any recommendation she deems necessary.

THAT the National Assembly recall its unanimous resolution of 12 May 2026, confirming the right of the Québec nation to determine its political status by an absolute majority, namely 50% of the valid votes cast plus one;

THAT it underline that the text of that resolution was sent to the office of the Prime Minister of Canada following its adoption;

THAT it reiterate to the Prime Minister of Canada the Québec-wide consensus behind the *Act respecting the exercise of the fundamental rights and prerogatives of the Québec people*;

THAT, lastly, it declare that no parliament or government may reduce the powers, authority, sovereignty or legitimacy of the National Assembly or a legislative assembly, or impose constraint on the democratic will of its people to determine its own future.

THAT the National Assembly recall that farm producers play an essential role in food safety and the economic development and vitality of Québec's regions;

THAT it underline that the increase in carbon costs puts tremendous pressure on agricultural operations, particularly in a context of inflation and economic uncertainty;

THAT the National Assembly support the reimbursement of the carbon cost for farmers.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Morin (Acadie), together with Ms. Blanchette Vézina (Rimouski), Ms. Poulet (Laporte) and Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent), moved:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge that, in Québec, the number of violent spouses who received the least punitive sentence in the *Criminal Code*, that is, a discharge, more than doubled over the last five years, increasing from 778 in 2020 to 1,823 in 2025;

THAT it be concerned by the situation and its effects on victims and their sense of security;

THAT it consider that such a situation may have long-term effects on the trust of victims and the public in our justice system;

THAT, lastly, it ask the federal government to remove the possibility for an accused to be discharged in cases of domestic violence.
