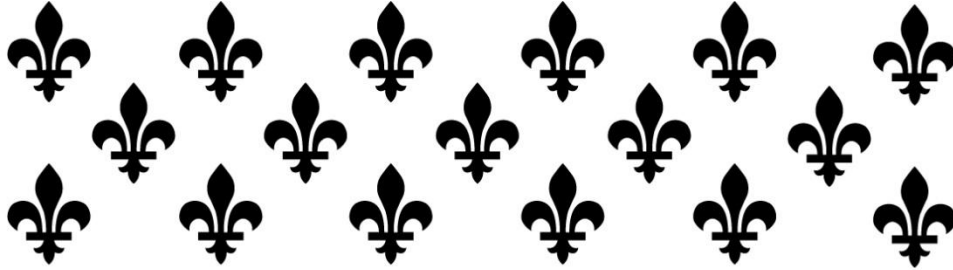

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Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Skeete, Minister Responsible for the Fight Against Racism, together with Ms. Cadet (Bourassa-Sauvé), Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), Mr. Boissonneault (Arthabaska), Mr. Dufour (Abitibi-Est), Ms. Poulet (Laporte) and Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), moved:

THAT the National Assembly most severely condemn the racist and supremacist gathering held in Shawinigan on 30 May 2026;

THAT it unequivocally denounce the rhetoric put forward at the gathering, which has no place in our society and is incompatible with Québec's democratic, egalitarian and inclusive values;

THAT it express its solidarity with all persons and communities who may have been hurt or concerned by this demonstration of hatred;

THAT, lastly, it recall that the fight against racism and ideologies of hate constitutes a collective responsibility and that all Quebecers have a role to play in promoting respect, inclusiveness and harmonious coexistence.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Cadet (Bourassa-Sauvé), together with Mr. Skeete, Minister Responsible for the Fight Against Racism, Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), Mr. Boissonneault (Arthabaska), Mr. Dufour (Abitibi-Est), Ms. Poulet (Laporte) and Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), moved:

THAT the National Assembly strongly condemn the white supremacist gathering held in Shawinigan;

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THAT it also strongly denounce hate speech, threats and calls for intimidation, in particular those made in Trois-Rivières against Muslim citizens, as well as the rise of anti-Semitic acts, as reflected by the increase in hate crimes against the Jewish community, from 331 to 920, seen between 2018 and 2024, according to Statistics Canada;

THAT it declare that such acts and speech are incompatible with the values of openness and tolerance that define Québec;

THAT, lastly, it reiterate its support for the law enforcement forces tasked with fighting against hate crimes and acts and that it express its solidarity with the victims of such acts.

The question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

THAT the National Assembly condemn the gathering held in Shawinigan under the racist slogan “I remember a white Québec”;

THAT, like Trois-Rivières mayor Jean-François Aubin, it denounce the hateful and racist speech and calls for violence made on social media following the prayer meeting organized by the Minhaj-as-Sunna mosque in Trois-Rivières;

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THAT it underline that the trivialization of hate speech legitimizes intolerance and encourages the transition from prejudices to public demonstrations of exclusion and discrimination;

THAT it recall that threats, hatred and calls for violence have no place in Québec;

THAT, lastly, it underline the importance for elected and public officials to send a clear and unequivocal message condemning racism, Islamophobia and all forms of supremacist speech.

The question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

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THAT, lastly, the National Assembly recall that Québec society is open and welcoming, and that skin colour or religion have no role to play in determining who belongs to it.

Business Having Precedence

Estimates of the National Assembly

On the motion moved by Ms. Lachance, Deputy Government House Leader, and pursuant to Standing Order 286, the Assembly resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole to examine the estimates of expenditure for the National Assembly for the 2026–2027 fiscal year.

At 3:14 p.m., Ms. D’Amours, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for a few minutes.

Committee of the Whole

Ms. D’Amours, Chair of the Committee of the Whole, informed the Committee that the period allotted for the examination of the estimates shall not exceed 2 hours and that the speaking time shall be distributed as follows: 20 minutes to the President for her opening remark; 41 minutes 15 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 28 minutes 7 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 9 minutes 22 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 8 minutes 45 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 15 seconds to each independent Member. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above.

The Committee of the Whole undertook examination of the estimates of expenditure for the National Assembly.

The examination of the estimates of expenditures for the National Assembly being concluded, Mr. Émond (Richelieu), member of the Committee of the Whole, reported to the Assembly.

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Opening Speech Debate

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 7 May 2026, on the Opening Speech of the Session, on the motion moved by Ms. Fréchette, Premier, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Fortin, Leader of the Official Opposition, Ms. Ghazal, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Ciccone (Marquette), Ms. Zaga Mendez (Verdun), Ms. Cadet (Bourassa-Sauvé), Ms. Setlakwe (Mont-Royal–Outremont), Mr. Morin (Acadie), Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion) and Mr. Kelley (Jacques-Cartier), subject to the receivability of these motions.

At the end of his address, Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly censure the CAQ government for its lack of consideration for Quebecers from immigrant backgrounds and its persistence in unfairly blaming them for its mismanagement of public finances, the housing crisis and the underfunding of our public services.

At the beginning of his address, Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for the mismanagement of public finances, the improper use of public funds and the implementation of measures that do not promote the economic development of Quebecers, that maintain a weak average GDP growth of 1 % and that have caused an unacceptable decrease in productivity over the last term.

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During her address, Ms. McGraw (Notre-Dame-de-Grâce) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly denounce the CAQ government's delay in giving Québec a real market diversification strategy and in preparing the revision of CUSMA, in a context in which Québec is excessively reliant on the United States while Québec companies, exporter regions and workers are already heavily affected by commercial uncertainty, particularly in key sectors such as steel, aluminum and lumber.

The debate continued on the Opening Speech of the Session, on the motion moved by Ms. Fréchette, Premier, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Fortin, Leader of the Official Opposition, Ms. Ghazal, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Ciccone (Marquette), Ms. Zaga Mendez (Verdun), Ms. Cadet (Bourassa-Sauvé), Ms. Setlakwe (Mont-Royal–Outremont), Mr. Morin (Acadie), Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), Mr. Kelley (Jacques-Cartier), Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage), Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), Mr. Paradis (Jean-Talon), Ms. Rotiroti (Jeanne-Mance–Viger), Ms. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques) and Ms. McGraw (Notre-Dame-de-Grâce), subject to the receivability of these motions.
