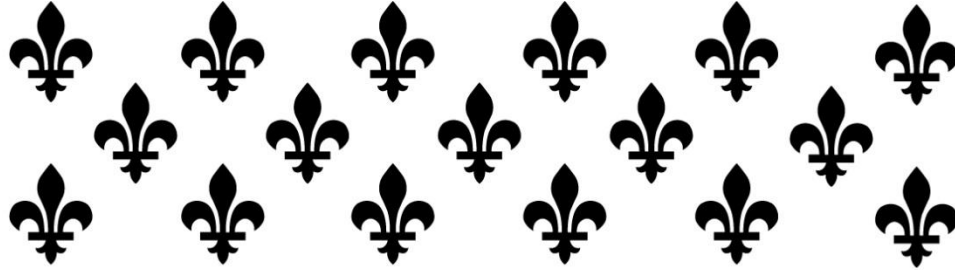

Appropriation Bills

By leave of the Assembly, Ms. Duranceau, Minister Responsible for Government Administration and State Efficiency and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, moved the introduction, passage in principle and passage of Bill 7, Appropriation Act No. 2, 2026–2027.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

4 June 2026

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Lafrenière, Minister Responsible for Relations with the First Nations and the Inuit, together with Mr. Morin (Acadie), Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage), Mr. Paradis (Jean-Talon), Mr. Chassin (Saint-Jérôme), Ms. Poulet (Laporte) and Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the fifth anniversary of the implementation of the Act to authorize the communication of personal information to the families of Indigenous children who went missing or died after being admitted to an institution;

THAT it recognize the traumas associated with the loss of a child that have been experienced by Indigenous families who have never had any answers;

THAT it pay tribute to these families for their strength, their resilience and the trust they have placed in the Awacak (little beings of light) association and in the Direction de soutien aux familles of the Secrétariat aux relations avec les Premières Nations et les Inuit;

THAT it applaud the exceptional work done by these two organizations, which have been guiding families in their search for truth and healing for five years now;

THAT, lastly, it observe a minute of silence in memory of the children who went missing or died after being admitted to an institution.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the request of Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

4 June 2026

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Prass (D'Arcy-McGee), together with Mr. Cliche-Rivard, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine), Ms. Poulet (Laporte) and Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the Semaine québécoise des personnes handicapées, held from 1 to 7 June, and that it reaffirm its commitment to the inclusion, full social participation and respect for the dignity of people with disabilities;

THAT it recognize all persons with profound intellectual and multiple disabilities (PIMD), a severe motor disorder caused by an early cerebral dysfunction, resulting in extremely reduced mobility, the considerable restriction of one's autonomy and a severe or profound intellectual impairment, frequently coupled with comorbidities;

THAT it recognize that these conditions create a situation of extreme physical, mental and social vulnerability, which require specific, specialized, essential and continuous services that are adapted to the complexity and evolution of their needs;

THAT it ensure access to fair, safe and adequately funded services to meet clinical, social and educational needs;

THAT, lastly, it ask the Government to swiftly implement effective measures to promote the development and maintenance of services and specialized expertise for people with profound intellectual and multiple disabilities.

The question was put on this motion, and an electronic division was thereupon demanded.

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly express its gratitude to these individuals for their essential contribution to the functioning of Québec democracy, in particular during the 43rd Legislature.

Ms. LeBel, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 3 be referred to the Committee on Institutions for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

Mr. Lafrenière, Minister of Domestic Security, moved that Bill 4, An Act respecting the communication of information for the purpose of protecting against intimate partner violence, and amending various legislative provisions, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried, and Bill 4 was accordingly passed in principle.

The motion was carried.
