Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 (3) and 185, Mr. Deltell, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Hamad, Minister responsible for the Capitale-Nationale region, Mr. Bérubé (Matane), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier) jointly moved:

THAT the National Assembly congratulate the Vanier Cup organizing committee;

THAT it mark the quality and professionalism of Laval University's organization as well as the outstanding success they were able to generate with this event that was presented for the first time in Québec.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 (2), 84.1 (3) and 185, Mrs. Boulet, Minister of Transport, Mr. Bergeron (Verchères), Mr. Grondin (Beauce-Nord), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier) jointly moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark National Safe Driving Week, which is held from 1 to 7 December 2009;

THAT it recall that road safety is a collective responsibility and reiterate the importance of adopting safe conduct on the road so that each person contributes to improving safety records.

Mr. Deltell, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. St-Arnaud (Chambly), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier) jointly moved a motion concerning the Corruption Zéro coalition; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 (2), 84.1 (3) and 185, Mrs. Marois, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Hamad, Minister responsible for the Capitale-Nationale region, Mr. Deltell, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, and Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) jointly moved:

THAT the National Assembly urge the Federal Government to act following the major fire that heavily damaged the Armoury in Québec City, located at the heart of Parliament Hill and the heritage precincts of the national capital, and that it ask that a project to rebuild the Armoury be initiated as soon as possible to give back to Québec City a building that is vital to its military and civilian life.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 (2), 84.1 (3) and 185, Mr. Trottier (Roberval), Mr. Hamad, Minister of Employment and Social Solidarity, Mr. Grondin (Beauce-Nord), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier) jointly moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government of Québec to commit to putting at the disposal of the retired workers of AbitibiBowater and of Fraser Papers a committee composed of tax experts, actuaries and lawyers for the purpose of protecting their interests and helping them make an informed decision in relation to the management of their pension fund.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 84.1 (2), Mr. Dupuis, Government House Leader, moved:

THAT Standing Order 118 (1) be modified by adding, in the first line, after the word "Agriculture,", the word "Fisheries," so that the "Committee on Agriculture, Energy and Natural Resources" henceforth be referred to by the name "Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources";

THAT this change take effect immediately this motion is carried.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Dupuis, Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

- the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 73, An Act to provide for measures to fight crime in the construction industry;
