Introduction of Bills

Mr. Béchard, Minister responsible for the Reform of Democratic Institutions, moved that leave be granted to introduce the following Bill:

An Act to amend the Election Act with regard to electoral representation and political party financing rules and to amend other legislative provisions

The motion was carried on division, Mr. Khadir (Mercier) having recorded his dissent.

Accordingly, Bill 78 was introduced in the Assembly.

Mrs. Beaudoin (Rosemont) moved that leave be granted to introduce the following Bill:

390 An Act to proclaim Ukrainian Famine and Genocide (Holodomor) Memorial Day

The question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 (3) and 185, Mrs. Beaudoin (Rosemont), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier) jointly moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec commit to giving consideration, no later than spring 2010 and in a diligent manner, to Bill 390 on the Holodomor, a bill of great importance to Québec's Ukrainian community.

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Finance on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 63, Business Corporations Act.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

Passage in Principle

Mr. Bachand, Minister of Finance, moved, —That Bill 74, An Act to amend various legislative provisions principally to tighten the regulation of the financial sector, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 74 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 74 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Public Finance.

The motion was carried.

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 24 November 2009, on the motion by Mr. Dupuis, Government House Leader, for the passage in principle of Bill 48, Code of ethics and conduct of the Members of the National Assembly.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and Bill 48 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 48 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Institutions.

The motion was carried.

At 12.46 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, Mr. Chagnon, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.04 o'clock p.m.

Passage in Principle

Mr. Lessard, Minister of Municipal Affairs, Regions and Land Occupancy, moved, —That Bill 76, An Act to amend various legislative provisions principally with regard to the awarding process for contracts made by municipal bodies, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 76 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Béchard, Deputy	Government House Leader, moved that Bill 76 be referred
for clause-by-clause considera	tion to the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain.

Mrs. Gagnon-Tremblay, Minister responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, moved the passage of Bill 65, An Act respecting Infrastructure Québec.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 65 was passed.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.
