Mr. Bachand, Minister of Finance, moved that leave be granted to introduce the following Bill:

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 11 November 2009, on the motion by Mrs. Thériault, Minister for Social Services, for the passage of Bill 56, An Act to amend the Act respecting health services and social services with regard to the certification of certain resources offering lodging to vulnerable clienteles (modified title).
