Deferred Divisions

THAT the National Assembly demand that the Government direct an independent public commission of inquiry to shed light on the allegations of corruption, embezzlement, collusion and organized crime infiltration in Québec's construction industry.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Blais, Minister responsible for Seniors, Mr. Drainville (Marie-Victorin), Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier) jointly moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the third International Day of Sign Language Rights to raise awareness among Members and the population regarding the rights and needs of deaf persons.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 (2), 84.1 (3) and 185, Mr. Kotto (Bourget), Mr. Lehouillier (Lévis), Mr. Deltell (Chauveau) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier) jointly moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the Journées de la culture, that it invite Quebecers to take part in large numbers in the various proposed activities, and that the State reiterate its support to the creation, production, dissemination and outreach of Québec culture worldwide.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 (2), 84.1 (3) and 185, Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mrs. Gaudreault (Hull), Mr. Bouchard (Vachon) and Mrs. Roy, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, jointly moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec join its voice to the thousands of people, including numerous Quebec citizens of Iranian origin, who gathered this week at the United Nations headquarters in New York City, to protest against the violation of human rights in Iran, to demand the liberation of prisoners of conscience and the respect of the democratic aspirations of the Iranian people.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 84.1 (2) and pursuant to Standing Order 146, Mr. Dupuis, Government House Leader, moved:

THAT, within the framework of the consideration of Bill 24, An Act to amend various legislative provisions concerning health, the Committee on Health and Social Services hold special consultations and hear Héma-Québec on 29 September 2009, immediately after Routine Proceedings for a period of one hour;

The presentation by this group shall last no more than 15 minutes and the exchange with the members of the Committee shall last no more than 45 minutes, which time shall be shared equally among the members of the parliamentary group forming the Government and the Members sitting in opposition;

The Minister of Health and Social Services shall be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mr. Tomassi, Minister of Families, moved the passage of Bill 7, An Act to establish an early childhood development fund and to amend the Act to establish the Fund for the promotion of a healthy lifestyle (*modified title*).

After debate thereon, the motion was carried on division and, accordingly, Bill 7 was passed.

At 12.42 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Dupuis, Government House Leader,, Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 1.00 o'clock p.m.
