THAT the National Assembly of Québec denounces the refusal of the Lieutenant-Governor of Québec to give account of his expenditures to the elected parliamentarians and that it informs the Lieutenant-Governor of Québec of its intention to oppose concurrence in any estimate relating to his duties.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Simard, Minister for Natural Resources and Wildlife, moved, —That Bill 77, An Act to amend the Cadastre Act and the Civil Code, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 77 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 77 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources.
