

Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Girard (Gouin), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), and Mr. Khadir (Mercier) jointly moved a motion concerning the secularity of the public institutions of Québec; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Charest, Premier, Mrs. Marois, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Deltell, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), and Mr. Khadir (Mercier) jointly moved:

THAT the National Assembly offers its condolences to the families and friends of the victims of the earthquake which struck Chile as well as to the Chilean community of Québec. The thoughts of the National Assembly are with all those who have been affected in any way by this natural catastrophe.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the request of Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

— the Committee on Institutions, to continue its public hearings within the framework of a general consultation on Bill 78, An Act to amend the Election Act with regard to electoral representation and political party financing rules and to amend other legislative provisions;

- the Committee on Transportation and the Environment, to continue its public hearings within the framework of a general consultation on the paper entitled "Vers un développement durable de la pratique";
- the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 57, Sustainable Forest Development Act (modified title).

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 143, Mrs. Houda-Pepin,

First Vice-President, gave the following notice:

— the Committee on Labour and the Economy will hold a deliberative meeting to determine whether it will consider the petitions tabled by the Members for Verchères, Bourget, and Chambly regarding a request for a public inquiry into the construction industry.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Curzi (Borduas) moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec demand that the Government accept the opinions expressed by the Conseil supérieur de la langue française and by the Parti Québécois regarding access to English schools in the wake of the decision of the Supreme Court, and that it subject unsubsidized private schools to the Charter of the French language.

Mr. Chagnon, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this motion: 10 minutes shall be allotted to the mover of the motion for his reply; five minutes shall be allotted to the Member for Mercier; three minutes 15 seconds shall be allotted to the other independent Members; seven minutes 45 seconds shall be allotted to the Second Opposition Group; and the rest of the time available shall be divided equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition. Within this framework any time not used by the independent Members or the Members from the Second Opposition Group shall be redistributed equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; and any time not used by the parliamentary group forming the Government shall be attributed to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition, and vice versa. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

Mr. Gautrin (Verdun) moved an amendment to the motion; this amendment could not be considered for want of consent by the mover of the motion.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Thursday, 11 March 2010, at 9.45 o'clock a.m.

The motion was carried.

Accordingly, at 4.58 o'clock p.m., Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Thursday, 11 March 2010, at 9.45 o'clock a.m.
