

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 53, Mrs. Courchesne, Minister of Education, Recreation and Sports, tabled the following:

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Charette (Deux-Montagnes), Mr. Dubourg (Viau), Mrs. Roy (Lotbinière), and Mr. Khadir (Mercier) jointly moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask the federal Government to grant visas on a priority basis to Haitian nationals who have obtained their Québec selection certificate.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate concluded, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 and 185, Mrs. James, Minister of Immigration and Cultural Communities, Mr. Charette (Deux-Montagnes), Mrs. Roy (Lotbinière), Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière), and Mr. Khadir (Mercier) jointly moved:

THAT the National Assembly note the Action Week Against Racism, which was observed from 11 to 21 March 2010.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate concluded, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 and 185, Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mrs. Thériault, Minister for Social Services, Mrs. Doyer (Matapédia), Mr. Bonnardel (Shefford), and Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière) jointly moved:

THAT, during this Semaine des travailleuses et travailleurs sociaux du Québec, under the theme "Passionately Yours," the National Assembly, on behalf of the population of Québec, recognize the competence, the professionalism, and the devotion of the employees in the public sector: the conscientious

teachers, school personnel, social workers, laboratory technicians, hospital pharmacists, nurses, nurses' aides, and attendants, secretaries, and public servants who each day provide the high-quality services that we demand of our public administration.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

— the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to continue clauseby-clause consideration of Bill 58, An Act to amend the Act respecting land use planning and development and other legislative provisions concerning metropolitan communities.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, gave the following notice:

— the Committee on Public Administration will hold a deliberative meeting for the purpose of organizing its proceedings and verifying certain financial commitments.

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 77, An Act to amend the Cadastre Act and the Civil Code, together with the amendments handed in by Mr. Simard, Minister for Natural Resources and Wildlife.

The amendments were declared in order.

After debate thereon, the amendments were carried.

The report, as amended, was concurred in.

At 11.36 o'clock a.m., at the request of Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.03 o'clock p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Bonnardel (Shefford) moved:

THAT the Committee on Public Administration hear Mr. Marc Bellemare before the conclusion of the current sessional period on the financing of political parties and that, for this purpose, it afford him parliamentary immunity.

Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this motion: 10 minutes shall be allotted to the mover of the motion for his reply; five minutes shall be allotted to the Member for Mercier; three minutes 15 seconds shall be allotted to the other independent Members; 33 minutes 45 seconds shall be allotted to the Second Opposition Group; 23 minutes shall be allotted to the Official Opposition; and 40 minutes shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Government. Within this framework any time not used by the independent Members or the Members from the Second Opposition Group shall be redistributed equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; and any time not used by the parliamentary group forming the Government shall be attributed to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition, and vice versa. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose on the motion moved by Mr. Bonnardel (Shefford).

At the request of Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, Mr. Bonnardel (Shefford) withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary on three occasions.

At the request of Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, Mr. St-Arnaud (Chambly) withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary on two occasions.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.
