Business Having Precedence

Debate on the Budget Speech

The Assembly resumed the debate on the motion by Mr. Bachand, Minister of Finance, —That this Assembly approves in general the budgetary policy of the Government, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mrs. Marois, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Aussant (Nicolet-Yamaska), Mr. Drainville (Marie-Victorin), and Mr. Bergeron (Verchères).

At the end of his speech Mr. Deltell, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal government for its 2010-2011 budget, which, in order to achieve fiscal balance, increases the tax burden on the taxpayers of Québec instead of making real reductions in expenses.

The debate continued on the motion by Mr. Bachand, Minister of Finance, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mrs. Marois, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Aussant (Nicolet-Yamaska), Mr. Drainville (Marie-Victorin), Mr. Bergeron (Verchères), and Mr. Deltell, Leader of the Second Opposition Group.

At the end of his speech Mr. Simard (Richelieu) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Premier and the Chair of the Conseil du trésor for their inability to control the Government's expenditures.

The debate continued on the motion by Mr. Bachand, Minister of Finance, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mrs. Marois, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Aussant (Nicolet-Yamaska), Mr. Drainville (Marie-Victorin), Mr. Bergeron (Verchères), Mr. Deltell, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, and Mr. Simard (Richelieu).

At the end of his speech Mr. Kotto (Bourget) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Premier, the Minister of Finance, and the Minister of Culture, Communications and the Status of Women who, through the short-sightedness of their budget, prove their inability to safeguard the cultural participation of the middle class within Québec.

The debate continued on the motion by Mr. Bachand, Minister of Finance, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mrs. Marois, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Aussant (Nicolet-Yamaska), Mr. Drainville (Marie-Victorin), Mr. Bergeron (Verchères), Mr. Deltell, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Simard (Richelieu), and Mr. Kotto (Bourget).

At 12.59 o'clock p.m., Mr. Chagnon, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.02 o'clock p.m.

Debate on the Budget Speech

The debate continued on the motion by Mr. Bachand, Minister of Finance, —That this Assembly approves in general the budgetary policy of the Government, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mrs. Marois, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Aussant (Nicolet-Yamaska), Mr. Drainville (Marie-Victorin), Mr. Bergeron (Verchères), Mr. Deltell, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Simard (Richelieu), and Mr. Kotto (Bourget).

At the end of his speech Mr. Curzi (Borduas) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Premier and the Minister of Education for having increased by only 2.2% the budget allocated to education, given the conspicuous needs, particularly with respect to those who drop out of school.

The debate continued on the motion by Mr. Bachand, Minister of Finance, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mrs. Marois, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Aussant (Nicolet-Yamaska), Mr. Drainville (Marie-Victorin), Mr. Bergeron (Verchères), Mr. Deltell, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Simard (Richelieu), Mr. Kotto (Bourget), and Mr. Curzi (Borduas).

Thirteen hours and thirty minutes having elapsed since Mr. Bachand, Minister of Finance, began the Budget Speech, the debate thereon was suspended in the Assembly to be resumed by the Committee on Public Finance, in compliance with the provisions of Standing Order 275.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mrs. Marois, Leader of the Official Opposition, moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec charge the Auditor General of Québec and the retired justice John Gomery with the task of determining the terms of reference and the membership of a commission of public inquiry into the allegations regarding the construction industry and the financing of the Québec Liberal Party.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this motion: ten minutes shall be allotted to the mover of the motion for her reply; one minute shall be allotted to the Member for Mercier; one minute shall be allotted to the other two independent Members; two minutes shall be allotted to the Second Opposition Group; the remaining time shall be divided equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition. Within this framework any time not used by the independent Members or the Members from the Second Opposition Group shall be redistributed equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; and any time not used by the parliamentary group forming the Government shall be attributed to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition, and vice versa. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose on the motion moved by Mrs. Marois, Leader of the Official Opposition.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:
